FACTORS AFFECTING CAPACITY

METHODOLOGY used is that of N.C. Dept. of Public Instruction or as mandated by legislated class size reductions.

- •A change in NCDPI maximum classroom membership. (NC Senate's proposed increase of 2 students per classroom not considered.)
- Reassignment of classroom space to non-regular curriculum.
- Demolition and removal of a portion of a school.
- Adding classrooms with new construction or renovation.
- Changing Elementary classroom to a different grade level.
- •Deductions for inadequate size of core facilities:
 - ie. Media Center, Cafeteria etc.

CAPACITY CALCULATIONS: ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

- K 3rd Grade Classrooms = <u>21 Students</u>
- 4th 5th Grade Classrooms = <u>26 Students</u>



DISTRICT WIDE CAPACITY vs. ADM TRENDS











North Buncombe Elementary Expansion Study





Criteria for Enrollment Projections

using Factored Cohort Advancement

- 11 years of attendance data with emphasis on the recent period between 2003-2004 and 2007-08. The best one of two months <u>ADM</u> (Average Daily Membership) is utilized to determine enrollment.
- Straight cohort advance projections simply move current student populations through the grade level sequence and have not proven to be reliable as the sole basis for projections. It assumes those students entering Kindergarten will absolutely graduate from the school. <u>Cohort</u>= a group of grade level students.
- Historical Survival Rates of cohorts is used to determine the average survival rate applied to each grade level. Survival Rate=the percentage number of students who progress to the next grade level in each school.
- District and individual school analyses of patterns and trends.
- Factoring applied to grade cohorts allows weighted projections based on potential change associated with housing development, demographic shifts, employment opportunities, home/charter schooling and dropout/dropout prevention.



BUNCOMBE COUNTY SCHOOLS CONSTRUCTION CRITERIA

The following criteria are ranked by order of importance for the purpose of establishing priorities for school construction:

- Facilities which contain progressively deteriorating conditions which, if not corrected, could prevent future use of the structure or result in safety concerns.
- 2. Immediate facility needs created by the loss of leased/rental space.
- Facilities which are overcrowded to the extent that regular classrooms
 or basic courses must be housed in single/double-wide trailers or
 other comparable substandard space which negatively affect the
 instructional program (if the option of floating teachers has been
 utilized at middle or secondary schools).
- 4. Facilities in which necessary specialized areas are lacking or extremely inadequate to accommodate a basic educational program.
- Pupil population projections clearly indicate that an increase in school population will occur in the near future, necessitating construction of new facilities for regular classrooms or basic courses.

- 7. Facilities wide gra

- Facilities where it is recognized that maximum enrollment for the facility and/or site has been exceeded, resulting in possible problems related to health, safety, or educational program delivery.

 - Any school facility that meets more than one of criteria 4 through 7 shall be advanced to a priority equal to the third criteria.
 - Projects costing less than \$100,000 may be funded through the regular capital outlay process.
 - A four classroom rule is in effect whereby any school requiring additional basic classrooms as a result of overcrowding or student population projections, shall house these additional classes in modular classrooms until such time that funds are identified for conventional replacement construction and when the number of basic classrooms exceed three (3). Conventional construction will be undertaken only in groups of four (4) or more classrooms.
