The following procedures are established to eliminate unnecessary idling of school buses:

A. GENERAL DRIVER PROCEDURES

All school/activity bus drivers shall comply with the following:

- 1. Conduct a pre-trip inspection of the bus.
- 2. Clean the needed windows and mirrors.
- 3. Start the bus.
- 4. Check other items as required.
- 5. When the oil and air pressure reach their normal operating range, begin the bus run/trip.
- 6. No warm-up time is allowed for school/activity buses (i.e., buses are prohibited from idling longer than five minutes, except in extraordinary circumstances or circumstances beyond the bus driver's control).
- 7. Buses are prohibited from any unnecessary idling on school grounds.

B. IDLING TIMES

- 1. Buses should not idle longer than five minutes.
- The following are considered extraordinary circumstances or circumstances beyond the driver's control for which an exception may be made to the fiveminute idling rule.
 - a. The bus is waiting in traffic.
 - b. The bus is loading or unloading students with special needs, as necessary.
 - c. There is a traffic, safety or emergency situation that necessitates idling.
 - d. The bus is undergoing maintenance, mechanical inspections or repair.
 - e. Extreme weather conditions (temperatures of less than 30 degrees Fahrenheit) are present, and the bus is idling for the purpose of warming the interior of the bus.
