I. For this meeting: SIT members were to go to departments and check list of committees. Also, solicit information about how committees could possibly be restructured.

Questions/comments from departments regarding restructuring committees:

- 1. MTAC meetings? When?
- 2. McFee hard for coaches to be on other committees due to sports commitments
- 3. Graduation Project emphasis is spread around so that all faculty share the duty
- 4. HQ committee Mr. Evans has spoken with retiring and new members; all is settled. It will be separate from PBIS
- 5. PBIS –Mr. Evans and Ms. Herrick are in agreement with combining Renaissance and PALS with PBIS
- 6. Are Key Club, Black Hawk Crossing, Black Hawks for Christ, FCA operational? Gerald and Teresa to follow up with these

II.
