Parent Responsibilities

We, as parents, will support our children's learning in the following ways:

- Monitoring attendance.
- Supervise the completion of my child's homework
- Read progress reports and discuss them with the teacher;
- Monitor both the amount of time my child spends with television and the type of programs watched.
- Communicate expectations for my child's education to the teacher and notify the teacher of any significant events or changes in my child's life;

- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my children's education.
- Promoting positive use of my child's extracurricular time.
- Staying informed about my child's education and communicating with the school by promptly
 reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child or by mail and
 responding, as appropriate.
- Attend at least one (1) parent/teacher conference either at the regularly-scheduled conference or at a convenient time to be arranged between the parent and teacher;
- Serving, to the extent possible, on policy advisory groups, such as being the Title I, Part A parent representative on the school's School Improvement Team, the Title I Policy Advisory Committee, the District wide Policy Advisory Council, the State's Committee of Practitioners, the School Support Team or other school advisory or policy groups.
