




About District 508

St. Peter residents have always cared about education. Early missions at Traverse des Sioux were educating children in 1844–five years earlier than the Minnesota Territory was incorporated and seven years before the Dakota sold this area to the United States.

The community and public education have grown up together. The first common school district was formed in 1854, the same year the city was first platted. In 1866, just 16 months after the new district opened its doors, overcrowding and poor conditions led voters to overwhelmingly approve a new school referendum 188 to 12.

Citizens continued to support the district, while students and faculty called the community home. Many events brought the two closer together. When flood waters rose in 1965, students volunteered to sandbag. After the 1998 tornado, the city and school district worked together to repair the damage and get lives back to normal. In 2015, residents approved construction of a new Saint Peter High School building and to repurpose the other three buildings which was completed in time for the 2017-18 school year.

Saint Peter High School offers the following programs to earn college credit:

* MSU College in School 24 credits
* Source Code Info Tech at SCC 12 credits

* Health Science Academy at SCC 3 credits

* Agri-Science Academy Ú of M 4 credits * Advanced Placement (AP) 4 opportunities

NOTE: in 2018-19, our students earned approximately 1,110 credits from MSU, U of M, and SCC saving parents/students approximately \$320,000 in tuition (based on tuition costs at MSU which is where the majority <1.026/1,110> of our credits are earned).

NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP Honors for SPHS

Saint Peter High School continued its recent run of success with students participating in the National Merit Scholarship program with two students earning high honors for their participation.

YANA BURGESS, a member of the Class of 2019, was named a 2019 National Merit Scholarship Finalist, one of just 15,000 out of the 1.6 million participants.

AMELIA WERNSING, also a Class of 2019 member, was named a Commended Student, placing her among the top 50,000 out of 1.6 million participants.
