On Tuesday, Dick Upham from the Atlantic Salmon Federation came to Southport to deliver 250 salmon eggs. Students in Mr. Shawn's classroom will begin an investigation on the lifecycle of Atlantic Salmon as well as the wide-ranging conservation efforts taking place to remove this Maine native from the endangered species list. In late April or early May, students will take the juvenile salmon to the Sheepscot River in Alna to release them into the wild.
