

### 2016 Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR) Annual Report and Public Hearing

February 8, 2017

The Texas Education Code (TEC), §39.306, requires each district's board of trustees to publish an annual report that includes the TAPR, district accreditation status, campus performance objectives, information on violent or criminal incidents, and information on the performance of the previous year's graduates in their first year of college, as reported by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

Each district's board of trustees must hold a public hearing to discuss the district's annual report within 90 days of receiving the TAPR on November 30, 2016 (winter break not included). Within two weeks following the public meeting, each district must widely publish its annual report, including posting it on the district website and other public places.

# **2016 Accreditation Status**

### La Joya ISD Status: Accredited

The Texas Education Agency awards an accreditation status to each public school district and charter school. The accreditation status is based on the academic accountability rating and financial ratings from the Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas. A district or charter must be accredited by the state to operate as a public school.












#### 2016 STAAR Percent at Postsecondary Readiness Standard




#### **2016 STAAR Percent at Advanced Standard**




#### **2016 STAAR Percent Met or Exceeded Progress**




#### **2016 STAAR Percent Exceeded Progress**




### 2016 STAAR Bilingual Dual One-Way Performance


#### **2016 STAAR LEP with Service vs No Service**



## **Graduation Rates**





# RHSP/DAP Graduates Longitudinal Rate








