GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

The Intervention Specialist TOSA, under supervision of the Director of Support Services is responsible for providing expertise in the planning, organizing, and coordinating of academic and behavioral/socio-emotional intervention supports for all TK-8 students. In addition, the Intervention Specialist provides communication support and professional development to staff in order to support the successful implementation of MTSS.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Provides professional development for certificated and classified staff, counselors, and site intervention teams on disaggregating data, developing systems for the implementation of academic and behavioral/socio-emotional intervention supports, and monitoring student progress.
- Monitors the success of district wide programs by gathering and analyzing student data. Works with school staffs to ensure district wide intervention programs are being implemented effectively.
- Provides support to general education and special education teachers to ensure that underperforming students, including English Language Learners and students with special needs, are provided with personalized intervention programs as needed.
- Assists staff in diagnosing individual student needs and designing intervention systems based on student needs.
- Assists staff with disaggregating and analyzing formative and summative assessments, and other district adopted assessment data to help guide the site's intervention programs and decisions.
- Assists staff with the planning, organization, and implementation of site level Response To Intervention
 (RTI) models and Universal Access (UA) for general education students as well as for English
 Language Learners and students with special needs, including: determining entrance and exit criteria,
 designing and modeling small group lessons.
- Assists staff in evaluating the effectiveness of various academic and behavioral/socio-emotional intervention support programs.
- Serves as a resource for site administrators by providing support in planning/delivering MTSS professional development.
- Travels between sites to support all students.
- Provides input to the Director of Student Support Services for monthly reports to the Board of Trustees.
- Performs any other duties as assigned.
