SPACE CAMP


Opts to Be Inducted into HALL OF FAME

Nassau County Executive and Bethpage alumnus Edward P. Mangano, together with the Nassau County Public High School Athletic Association, is slated to establish a Nassau County High School Athletics Hall of Fame. Among the HOF's first inductees will be former Bethpage football coach Howard Vogts. Nominees had to exemplify the high standards of sportsmanship, ethical conduct and moral character in order to be considered for induction.

Coach Vogts is New York State's All-Time Winningest High School Football Coach with 61 total wins. He founded the district's football program in 1953 and was the head coach for 55 years, winning Nassau County Coach of the Year 12 times during his tenure. Under Coach Vogts, Bethpage won 29 regular season League I conference championships, three Rutgers Cups and five Long Island titles. The district dedicated its athletic field in his honor in 1989.

Coach Vogts will be formally inducted on Sept. 30. The HOF will be temporarily located in the rotunda of the Theodore Roosevelt Executive and Legislative Building in Mineola until plans for its permanent home are finalized.

Seniors in Larry Portuese's classes at Bethpage High School were asked to create and teach a maritime festival for third-graders from each of the district's elementary schools.

Formerly a living science teacher, Mr. Portuese began the festival 14 years ago to breed a love for the ocean and all things nautical, as well as bring attention and appreciation to the fact that students live on an island. Now a forensic science teacher, he spends a week teaching his students the skills of rope making, fish dissection and fishing to continue this annual tradition for the elementary students of Bethpage.

The maritime festival contained six workshops, which the third-graders rotated through during a two-hour timeframe. Some of the activities included rope making, a scuba diving lecture,

examining plankton, touch tanks that contained local marine life, fish dissections and fish painting.

During the rope making activity, 12th-graders explained the history of Long Island as a whaling center and asked third-graders questions about the importance of rope. Nautical rope was then made from scratch with an 18th-century machine that turns twine into usable rope.

In an effort to better understand how experts search underwater for sea life, third-graders learned about scuba diving from an instructor who performed a dive for the students, described the equipment used and answered questions relating to the safety of scuba diving.

Touch tanks allowed third-graders to get their hands wet by touching sea creatures. Some of these creatures included horseshoe crabs, hermit crabs and eel, which the 12th-graders had caught on a local fishing trip with Mr. Portuese the day before.

As part of the dissection, which was done by the high school students, the students spoke about the anatomy of fish and how they breathe underwater through gills. In another workshop, students had an opportunity to see plankton up close using a microscope.

Fish printing was done utilizing the Japanese art of Gyotaku, which uses a thin, translucent paper to transfer the image of a fish. The third-graders were able to create their own fish prints by patting the paper onto a painted fish.

These activities served to excite the elementary students about the aquatic world, as well as foster a mentorship between the elementary and high school students.

More than 100 packs of stickers were collected and donated in June to the hospital.
