

#### Bethpage Student Nationally Recognized for Achievements In Technology

Maya Maciel-Seidman, a junior at Bethpage High School, was awarded the National Center for Women and Information Technology Award for Aspirations in Computing for her academic excellence, leadership and aspirations for women in computing and technology. As the only recipient from New York State, Maya was one of 40 national award winners out of an applicant pool of more than 4,700.

"I am truly honored to be a 2020 NCWIT

Aspirations in Computing Award National Winner," said Maya. "I am so thankful for all of the amazing opportunities I have had to pursue my passion for computer science and develop my skills in technology at Bethpage High School."

In recognition of her achievement, Maya received a certificate of recognition from the State of New York Executive Chamber, signed by Gov. Andrew Cuomo, for being the only student from New York to be named a national winner. Some of Maya's other technology and computing related accomplishments include qualifying for the Regeneron International Science and Engineering Fair and being awarded the FIRST Robotics Dean's List.

Maya hopes to inspire other young women to become involved in computing and technology. "I hope that by winning this award, I am able to show younger female students they too have a place in the realm of STEM and they can also be successful in computer science and technology."
