The possibility of rain could not stop Bethpage High School's Class of 2023 from celebrating their commencement on June 23. The ceremony went on without a hitch at the Bethpage Athletic Complex where proud building and central administrators, Board members, faculty, family and friends gathered for the momentous occasion.

Dressed in their blue caps and gowns, the graduates arrived onto the football field to "Pomp and Circumstance," performed by the Bethpage High School band. Senior Graziella Conte kicked off the ceremony by performing the national anthem.

The Class of 2023 heard from Student Council President Marnes Richemond, salutatorian Caio DaSilva and valedictorian Stephanie Pilnacek. Each thanked their support systems and shared meaningful messages with their peers.

"No matter how far we go, whether it's just the next town over or taking advantage of working or studying abroad, we are and forever will be Bethpage," Marnes said. "We have left a lasting impression on this school that future generations will follow."

In his salutatorian address, Caio spoke about his accountability mirror which

CAREERS IN EDUCATION AND BEYOND AT BETHPAGE HIGH SCHOOL

High school is all about growing both academically and socially, while also discovering your passions. This is why Bethpage High School's coursework is designed to help students navigate that ageold question: "What do you want to be when you grow up?" Our Bethpage students have the unique chance to explore what career path they would like to take after graduation through special classes and experiences.

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Three years ago, the high school started offering a new half-year course, Careers in Education, for students interested in becoming a teacher or administrator. The class is run by English teacher Maria Whalen and gives high schoolers the opportunity to enhance their public-speaking skills and leadership abilities, while developing lesson plans and walking in the shoes of a classroom teacher. This year, the class featured 20 juniors and seniors who met every day and engaged in hands-on experiences. They participated in an array of activities, lessons and projects in class and took trips to experience teaching different grade levels. This included engaging in lessons with students at the high school, observing classroom lessons at John F. Kennedy Middle School and student teaching at the elementary schools.

Senior Marnes Richemond, who was enrolled in Careers in Education last year, said that the course helped him determine what he wanted to do in the future.

"I couldn't see myself in a cubicle," he said, "but I knew I wanted to work with people."

Through Careers in Education, Marnes found a passion for working with students. He spent last summer further developing what he learned in the classroom by working for the Bethpage Schools' ESY (Extended School Year) program.

Both former and current students have raved about the welcoming environment, the strong connection to their peers and the

exceptional guidance that they have received from Ms. Whalen.

"I love the people in this class," said senior Konstantine Drosos. "It's not a Careers in Ed class, it's a Careers in Ed family."

Aside from Careers in Education, Bethpage High School has a strong partnership with BOCES. With a wide variety of trade and technical programs available, students can enroll in vocational education courses such as automotive technology, cosmetology, electrical technology, medical assisting and police science/criminal justice. Those enrolled in vocational programs attend Bethpage High School for a half-day for their academic subjects and then spend the other half at one of the BOCES centers. Offering this coursework outside of the high school prepares Bethpage students for the real world of work or continued postsecondary occupational education.

In addition to specific coursework, Bethpage High School students can better pinpoint their interests through the school's Career Expo. The expo was held this spring during the school day and allowed students to speak with a wide range of different professionals. Through events such as the Career Expo and coursework tailored to specific careers, our students are prepared to leave the high school with a clear focus on where the future can take them.

Bethpage: The Hub of Robotics⁰

The Bethpage Robotics Program has grown tremendously over the years. Secondary school teams, Bethpage High School's Regal Eagles and John F. Kennedy Middle School's RoboEagles, have had a successful 2022-2023 school year, and our elementary teams have hit the ground running as this marked the first school year of an elementary robotics program in the district.

Throughout the months, Bethpage robotics members showcased their hard work and skills with schools both locally and worldwide, making Bethpage a true leader in the robotics arena. In December, the district partnered with FIRST Long Island to host the FIRST Lego League Tournament Practice Challenge at Central Boulevard Elementary School. Forty-two teams from across Long Island participated in the event, practicing with their robots before their competition qualifiers in the new year. John F. Kennedy Middle School's RoboEagles, under the direction of Stella Gatanas, was among the participants. Bethpage High School's Regal Eagles, led by coaches Leon LaSpina and Dr. Eric Kay, was involved as well, as the members sold breakfast, lunch, snacks, beverages and holiday ornaments and raised more than \$1,000 to support their upcoming building and competition season.

March was a busy month as our robotics teams continued competing and hosting events on school grounds. The Regal Eagles hosted the fifth annual Regal Eagle Rampage at Bethpage High School on March 5. The event featured 20 FIRST Robotics Competition teams from throughout the region. Attendees finetuned their robots and practiced in a noncompetitive environment before their respective regional events. In addition, the district's FIRST Lego League Robotics teams from John F. Kennedy Middle School and Central Boulevard, Charles Campagne and

Kramer Lane elementary schools were stationed at exhibit tables to share their build projects from the season.

The Regal Eagles continued to showcase their leadership as they hosted the FIRST Technology Challenge Long Island Championships at Bethpage High School on March 12. Twenty-four FIRST Technology Challenge teams from across the region were in attendance for the robotics competition. While the district does not have a FIRST Technology Challenge team, the Regal Eagles were hands-on at the event, selling breakfast, lunch, beverages and snacks to support their build and competition season. In addition, the Regal Eagles gave tours of their lab and showcased their robot.

The Regal Eagles closed out the month on a high note as the team participated in the FIRST Robotics Competition Long Island Regionals No. 1 and No. 2 from March 20-25. Throughout the week, the team students persevered through many challenges with their robot and proudly received the Engineering Inspiration Award and the Gracious Professionalism Award. By earning the Engineering Inspiration Award, the Regal Eagles was invited to participate in the FIRST Robotics Competition World Championships from April 19-22 in Houston, with NASA covering

the team's registration cost. This marked the seventh consecutive year that the Regal Eagles earned a spot in the world championships.

"The successful run demonstrated by the Regal Eagles earning the right to go to FIRST Robotics Competition World Championships for the seventh consecutive year is truly remarkable," Director of Technology Andrew Choi said. "This group continues to inspire me as I watch them creatively engineer, problem solve, use critical thinking, collaborate with other teams and hone their logic, all while doing this with class and professionalism. They are exceptional role models for STEM and robotics in their school community and beyond."

The team continued to share their love of STEM and robotics this past spring as they were invited to News 12 on May 1 for its grand opening of the television station's new studio. The team joined other community organizations in the marketplace area where they provided robot demonstrations and helped spread awareness about robotics and STEM.
