Franklin County Prevention Task Force - Opiate Subcommittee Update for CIP(11/8/17)

The number of children being placed in foster care due to parental substance abuse, specifically opiate/heroin use, is rising dramatically. Treatment for addicted parents takes considerably longer than the timeline DSS is given by the court system for permanency planning for the children (currently a 15-22 months). The goals for this subcommittee are to:

- A. Develop a set of targeted interventions supported by the data collected to intervene sooner in the addiction cycle.
- B. Utilize Evidence-Based Practices/Strategies to encourage healthy lifestyle choices.

First round of data collection completed April 30th, 2017. (DSS – CPS cases):

Demographics

- 18 out of 53 family units had both mother and father residing in the home.
- Average number of children per family = 1.96
- Average age of children = 7.09 (n = 102)
- Average age of mothers = 29.58 (n = 48)
- Average age of fathers = 34.64 (n = 36)
- Average age of parent subs = 33.86 (n = 14)
- Average age of all caregivers = 32.69 (N = 98)

Common Substances Used

The most commonly used substances remain marijuana and alcohol, which are commonly available and also have a higher degree of social acceptance or less stigma associated with use.

- Marijuana = 30 / 53 cases = 56.6%
- Alcohol = 23 / 53 cases = 43.4%

Opiate / Opiod / Agonist

Opiates and opiods produce similar effects and the pattern of use and abuse have negligible differences. Opiates include heroin.

- Opiates = 10 / 53 cases = 18.87%
- Opiods = 5 / 53 cases = 9.43%
- Suboxone = 9 / 53 cases = 16.98%

Second Round of Data Collection started 10/1/17 and will run through 12/31/17. Additional Questions added to data collection include Previous History of MH/SUD, treatment history/referral and previous court involvement.

OTHER UPDATES:

- Questionnaire created (still in draft form) to administer to 9th and 12th grade students to determine areas of greatest concern. Can also be completed by general population. Will be engaging partners for participation.
- Creating focus groups with cross-section of population to determine community readiness/willingness to address areas of concern.
- Conducting 2 Opioid Forums at Bare Hill Correctional Facility for staff and families on 11/15 and 12/20.
- Considering additional community forums that encourage maximum participation/engagement.
- Still exploring education curriculum for specific adult populations.
