SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

Traditional High School Students

- 1. The applicant for this scholarship shall be from Greenville, Rockwood, Shirley, Beaver Cove or unorganized territories attending Greenville High School. Preference for award of this scholarship will be given to the son, daughter, grandson, granddaughter, sister or brother of a veteran of the United States Armed Forces. The recipient of this scholarship will be a high school graduate wishing to further his/her education at a college or technical school and is in need of financial assistance to continue his or her education.
- 2. Each Applicant shall submit a scholarship application form.
- Each applicant shall submit a current high school transcript including extra curricular
 activities, participation in school events and other school activities, community service
 and community activities.
- 4. Each applicant will submit a personal letter describing the need for financial assistance and stating which college you will be attending and your field of interest.
- 5. The applicant will be of good character. Submit 2 letters of recommendation (not from a relative).
- 6. Each applicant will submit a 200 word essay on: "What is Americanism" or "What is a citizen's obligation to serve the community, state or nation.
- 7. The complete application will be submitted to the Scholarship Committee, Cecil R. Cole American Legion Post # 94, PO Box 1222, Greenville, Maine 04441 through the Greenville High School Guidance Counselor no later than 15 May.
- 8. The winners of the American Legion Scholarships will be announced at the Greenville High School Graduation Ceremony.
- 9. The scholarship will be paid after the first semester grades from the college are submitted to American Legion Post #94 showing satisfactory performance of a GPA of 2.0 or higher. The check will be payable to the college or technical school to be credited to the students account. The student should include the correct address of the school where the scholarship payment should be sent.

Non Traditional Students - Members of the American Legion Family

- 1. Students that are members of the American Legion Family (Legion, Auxiliary or SAL) will be eligible for an American Legion Post 94 Scholarship if they are attending a two or four degree program at a community college, four year college or university.
- 2. The scholarship request will be submitted to the American Legion Post 94 by letter and will include the following:
 - Name of the College or University and the status of the student (e.g. full or part time student), the progress the student has made (e.g. how many credits have been completed and grade point average) and proof that the student is enrolled in a degree granting program.
 - A statement of financial need.
 - A statement of career goals.
 - A statement of the importance of higher education for the development of good citizenship by the requesting individual.

3. The application will be submitted to the American Legion Post 94 no later than 30 April each year. The scholarship Committee will announce winners in May. Payment of the scholarship will be made directly to the College or University in the name of the winning student.
