# What is College Credit Plus?

- College Credit Plus is Ohio's dual credit program
  - Students earn high school and college credit at the same time
  - Students enroll in college courses and adhere to the requirements of the college
  - Carrollton is responsible for tuition and textbook costs (student must successfully complete the course or families will be responsible for these costs)



# What is College Credit Plus?

- Students in Grades 7 through 12 are eligible:
  - Must complete a college application
  - Must complete a placement exam (ACT/Accuplacer) and be determined “eligible” for CCP (college ready in English, Reading or Math)
    - ACT (English 18, Reading 22, Math 22)
    - Accuplacer (Writeplacer 5, Reading 250, Math 263)
  - May choose from a variety of college-level courses (as determined by placement testing)
  - Courses must be college-level or non-remedial and nonreligious



# What is College Credit Plus?

- Students in Grades 7 through 12:
  - Can earn credit to satisfy both high school and college requirements
    - 3+ Credit Hours = 1 High School Unit
  - Must successfully complete the courses in order to earn the credit
  - May take courses at the high school, college campus, or online

# CCP Yearly Credit Limits

- Students can take up to 30 credits within each school year (Summer, Fall, Spring) at *potentially* no cost to the student/family.
  - If a student fails a course or does not complete a course, the student may be responsible for the ENTIRE cost associated with the course. This happens every year- *please consider the maturity level of your student!*
- High school credits count into the 30 credit total.  
**(HS Credits x 3) + College Credits = Total Credits**

# Credit Hours - Example

**“John Smith” is taking non CCP Math, Science, and English at the high school (3 courses= 9 credits), his formula would look like this:**

- **$30-(3 \times 3)$  = Maximum number of CCP credit for one academic year**
- **$30-9= 21$  credits available for CCP courses and more high school credit**

If a student enrolls in more than 30 credit hours for the year, the school will discuss with the student whether to:

- **Drop the course or**
- **Pay for the entire course (including tuition, fees, books) at the colleges standard rates.**

# CCP Underperforming



## CCP Probation

Students with a CCP GPA lower than a 2.0 or a student who withdraws from two or more courses in the same term may be placed on probation. If so, the student:

- May only enroll in one college course that semester, and
- May not enroll in a course in the same subject area in which a D, F, or NC grade (or equivalent) was received.

## CCP Dismissal

If students on CCP probation do not increase their CCP GPA to a 2.0 or above during the probation term, they will be placed on CCP Dismissal.

- Student may not enroll in any CCP classes for at least one term.

# Mature Content

Students enrolling in CCP may be subject to Mature Content. Information about the potential for mature subject matter is defined in section 3365.035 of the Revised Code. In courses in which the student intends to enroll, students and parents must be aware that courses will not be modified based upon program enrollee participation regardless of where course instruction occurs.

**Parents and students must sign a permission form and students must complete a questionnaire in order to participate in CCP.**

Students will not be enrolled in courses until the permission form and questionnaire are completed as a part of the college admissions process.

# Athletic Eligibility

## **Student athletes should:**

- be enrolled in 6 courses the nine weeks before your sport begins.
- learn the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) requirements.
- know that summer term CCP courses cannot be used to bring a student into compliance with the OHSAA requirements for interscholastic athletic participation.
- **CCP student is responsible for ensuring they are athletically eligible.**

# CCP Credit Transfer

- It is up to the **college/university** to decide if and how credits transfer. In general, most courses in your intended major will **not** transfer. Therefore, most students take general education courses that tend to transfer more easily.

  - You will need to create a free account.
  - Students can enter which course they are taking and see how many schools in the Transferology network have matching courses for which credit may be awarded when they transfer.

# CCP on CHS Campus

- Students take classes at CHS during the typical school day
- Partnership with Stark State College
- Classes count towards high school graduation requirements while earning college credit
- Credit is guaranteed to transfer to all PUBLIC colleges and universities in Ohio. It is always up to the receiving college on the credits they accept and how they are applied

# CCP at Carrollton High School & Pathways to an Associate's Degree

**Students can earn an Associate  
of Arts through Stark State  
College Credit Plus (CCP).**

Stark State Associate's Degrees are the first step to a Bachelor's Degree, providing a foundation in general education with special emphasis on earning a Bachelor's Degree.

Students do not have to follow an Associate's Degree to participate in College Credit Plus. These pathways are an additional way to utilize college coursework at the high school.

- What is College Credit Plus (CCP)?
  - CCP allows a qualified 7-12<sup>th</sup> grade student to take college classes while still in high school
  - Level 1 courses
  - Lead to certificates and/or associate degrees
    - Examples: Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, and University of Cincinnati pathway, technical pathways
- What is Learn to Earn?
  - Earn industry credential and pathway to graduation
  - Partnerships with employers that offer mentoring, job shadowing, tuition reimbursement, and employment opportunities
- Where can you take classes?
  - On college campus
  - Online
  - High School
  - Combination of all of the above modalities
- What are the requirements?
  - Next-Gen ACCUPLACER and/or ACT/SAT scores

  - Appointment with Stark State College CCP Enrollment Representative
    - If course(s) are offered outside their high school only


**UMU provides discipline specific advising for students to assure they choose the correct courses for programs such as: engineering, pre-health professions, business, science, nursing**
