WHAT IS THE FEASIBILITY STUDY?

FACTS

- The current condition of Roosevelt requires the building to be rebuilt or closed
- Building conditions vary across district
- Useable property size varies across district
- Educational opportunities vary across district
- Enrollment declined by 885 students (2000-2018)
- Class sizes vary from 9-19 students across district
- Will maintain fiscal responsibility (Closing a school could result in up to 4% savings to tax levy)

FIVE POSSIBLE SCENARIOS BEING CONSIDERED (In no particular order)

CLOSE ROOSEVELT (three-year plan)

- District changes attendance zones
- Building preparations made to accommodate Roosevelt students at Mann, Coolidge, MacArthur and Wilson.
- Staff given new assignments
- Students start in new schools

REBUILD ROOSEVELT (no closures)

- Secure funds for new Roosevelt school
- Current students move to temporary schools
- Construction
- Students return to new building (based on funding may take 4 to 15 years to complete due to ammount of NYS building aid available)

STEPS IF OPTIONS 3, 4 or 5 ARE TAKEN

- Secure funds for new Roosevelt School
- Decide best use of closed building and land
- Redistribute Roosevelt students and staff to temporary assignments
- Construction of new Roosevelt
- Roosevelt students and staff return to new building
- Students and staff from closed building redistributed to new school assignments
- Old building is ready for new purpose
