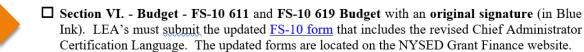

Applicants must submit the following to be substantially approvable. Please use this as a check list to ensure that all requested materials have been submitted:

- □ The Application Cover Page with original signature of the Chief School/Administrative Officer (in Blue Ink).
- Section I. Maintenance of Effort (MOE).
- □ Section II. LEA Certification for the Payment of Funding to Approved Special Education Providers (ASEPs) Please select ONE option.
- Section III. Coordinated Early Intervening Services (CEIS) Calculation Worksheet.

This is necessary if the LEA is required to (Mandatory CEIS Redirect) or has opted to use up to 15 percent of funds for CEIS (Optional CEIS). This must reflect funds being spent toward services that are provided to assist students in kindergarten through grade 12 (with a particular, emphasis on students in kindergarten through grade three) who are **not** currently identified as needing special education or related services, but who need additional academic and/or behavioral assistance to enable them to be successful in a general education environment. Please note that the items and costs represented on these worksheets must be reconcilable to their corresponding grants. Article 81 School Allotments for the 2017-2018 Program Year

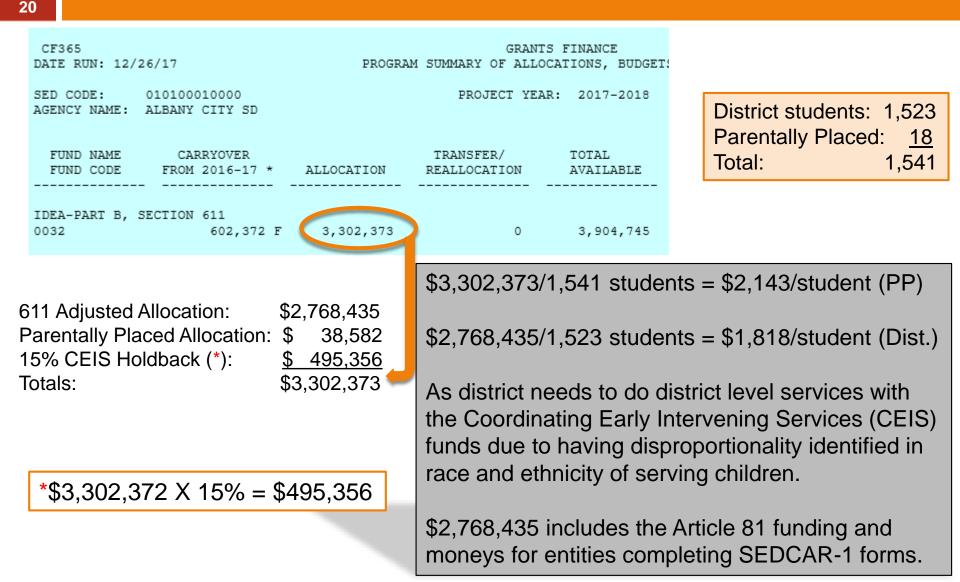
A notice of an Article 81 allotment was sent to each Local Education Agency (LEA) designated to receive school year 2017-2018, IDEA, Section 611 and Section 619 federal funds attributable to students with disabilities placed by the courts or other State agencies, and provided educational services pursuant to Article 81 of the Education Law. Copies of the notices of allotment were also sent to the approved special education programs that serve students placed pursuant to Article 81

Each LEA should have received a SEDCAR-2 form from each Article 81 school that designated the LEA to receive additional allocations. The designated LEAs must provide an amount equal to the additional allocation, identified below, to each Article 81 school. The allocation may be through State, local or federal funds. If a LEA uses federal funds, the amounts must be allocated to section 611 or 619 funds as indicated on the chart below
