## **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

Class of 2019: 110 credits, which includes four years of English, four years of mathematics, three years of science, three years of social studies (including one year of United State history), one year of health, two years of physical education, and the completion of a senior capstone project. ## **CURRICULUM FEATURES**

Advanced Placement courses are offered in U.S. History, Calculus A/B, Biology, Physics, Chemistry, English 11 and English 12, Spanish, World History, and Studio Art. Juniors may take up to 2 AP courses; Seniors may take up to 3. Senior Capstone Project pathways include Senior Project or Digital Portfolio. Special Programs/Services: Homework Club, Community Service, Assabet Valley Collaborative, WAVM Radio and Television Productions, Work Study, Best Buddies, School to Career Regional Partnership, Virtual High School, Dual Enrollment, and ESOL classes, and independent study program. Special Education: Learning Center/Resource Room and a Connections program.
