The Klamath-Trinity Joint Unified School District (KTJUSD) is comprised of one high school, five elementary schools, and one continuation high school.

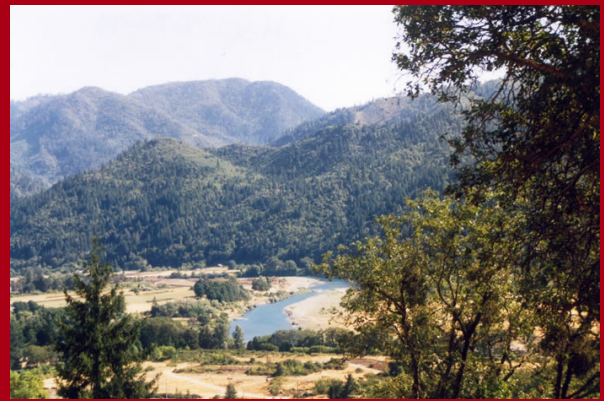
The District operates a \$23.7 million budget with an enrollment of 1,052 of which 90% qualify for free and reduced meals.



The District is governed by a seven member board with the District Office being centrally located on the Hoopa Indian Reservation. The boundaries overlap both Humboldt and Trinity counties. The District is located within the traditional boundaries of the

Hoopa, Yurok, and Karuk Tribes, which provide a diverse and rich culture to the District.

Community Profile



Klamath-Trinity Joint Unified School District is located approximately 325 miles north of San Francisco and 63 miles north-east of Eureka. The primary industries are forest-related businesses, tourism and recreation. The area's natural landscape is strikingly beautiful. It offers a wide range of outdoor activities, including hiking, fishing, backpacking and white water rafting.
