

As the New York State English and Math assessments for grades 7 & 8 approach, I would like to clarify our school's philosophy of assessments as well as the messages that we are working to convey to students. Our District has adopted the goal of "fostering a growth mindset," and I believe this best characterizes our beliefs about assessments. It is our goal that each and every student give their best effort each day. Our teachers have worked to ensure that students recognize the importance of the assessments as a measure of individual growth. The "baseline" established by a student's score in the prior year is utilized as the foundation to measure their growth over the following year. These assessments are designed to help students, families, and educators

ensure that all students are prepared for the assessment challenges they will encounter in the future - including Regents exams, AP exams, and college and career placement exams such as the SAT and ASVAB.

I also remind our students that our assessment results are used to evaluate and compare our district to others, and that we are proud to have compared favorably to many of our neighbors throughout the years. The fact that New York State has taken steps to decouple the assessments from the teacher evaluation process was clearly the right decision and should allow our students to focus on what truly matters to their educational futures. When it

comes to preparing for standardized tests, some time-tested tips still ring true. Students need a good night's sleep and a good breakfast. Additionally, I would continue to remind students to read independently for at least thirty minutes per night. The middlehigh school library is still accessible to students despite the ongoing construction work on campus.

We look forward to a busy and exciting spring athletic season. Our baseball, softball, and track teams have been hard at work.

News From the Counseling Department

Genesee Community College is once again offering The Genesee Promise Plus initiative. Under this initiative every student who graduates from a Genesee-Livingston-Orleans-Wyoming high school in June will receive a full tuition scholarship for one or two summer courses beginning this June. All June 2019 graduates are eligible whether they plan to attend Genesee, another college or university, or even if they have not made college plans for the fall. This program is also offered to current juniors soon to be seniors in the fall as well as any new adult college students. Students may attend courses

> at the Batavia Campus, or at any of the six campus centers (Albion, Arcade, Batavia, Dansville, Lima, Medina, and Warsaw).

The goal in establishing this scholarship program is to encourage everyone in the GLOW area to attend college and hopefully, increase the interest of 2019 high school graduates in some form of post secondary education.

The Genesee Promise Plus guarantees a full tuition scholarship for one or two summer courses at Genesee this summer. All it takes to get started is a Genesee Community College admissions application and GPP scholarship form, both of which can be located at the following link on their web site:

AP Testing

Listed below is the AP exam schedule for the 2018-2019 school year. All testing will take place in the Elementary Building on Main St. in Lyndonville. If students drive, they may park in the back parking lot.

Students should bring the following items to the exam room:

- Several sharpened No. 2 pencils (with erasers) for completing multiple-choice answer sheets
- Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for freeresponse questions in most exams
- A watch (in case your exam room does not have a clock that you can see easily)
 Up to two calculators with the necessary capabilities if you are taking an AP Calculus, Chemistry,
 Physics, or Statistics Exam. (Visit www.collegeboard.com/ap/calculators to learn more about the calculator policy for each of these exams, and for a list of authorized calculators.)
- A ruler or straightedge if you are taking an AP Physics Exam
- Your social security number for identification purposes (optional). If you provide it, the number will appear on your AP score reports.
- Your College Board SSD Accommodations Letter if you are taking an exam with approved testing accommodations (if applicable)

Students should not bring the following to the exam room:

- Cell phones, digital cameras, personal digital assistants (PDAs), BlackBerry smart phones, Bluetooth-enabled devices, MP3 players, e-mail/messaging devices, or any other electronic or communication devices
- Books, compasses, mechanical pencils, colored pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, or notes
- Rulers and straightedges (except as noted above)
 Scratch paper (notes can be made on portions of the exam booklets or, for Chinese Language and Culture and Japanese Language and Culture, on scratch paper provided by the proctor)
