United Way of Long Island's DREAMS for Youth Scholarship Program provides financial support so **Long Island Youth** can pursue their dreams and aspirations.

Based on the belief that financial need should not be a barrier to achieving one's potential, the mission of DREAMS is to provide financial assistance in two distinct areas: academic and enrichment. The scholarship program is open to seventh to twelfth grade **Long Island Youth** who demonstrate financial need and a commitment to community service.

DREAMS is an integral part of United Way's focus on what matters most in our community. In order to achieve positive change in the lives of Long Islanders, United Way of Long Island, together with our community partners, advances the common good by investing in and developing programs that address Long Islanders' critical needs in education, income/financial stability and health. United Way proudly supports over 100 health and human service agencies across Long Island.

With the generous support of the late Ben Pace, founder of the Dreams R Us Foundation, the DREAMS for Youth Scholarship Program was developed in 2001. Since then, more than \$1 million in scholarships have been awarded to more than 300 students.

"The dreams of our youth are the building blocks for our future. As students realize their dreams, they bring to light a path for the next generation of dreamers to follow. It is my hope that the DREAMS for Youth Scholarship recipients dream big and inspire others to do the same."

Academic Scholarship: \$1,000 - \$5,000

The academic scholarship award assists graduating 12^{th} grade students with low to medium income who need financial assistance in order to advance their education. Academic awards are designed to assist with the cost of tuition to vocational schools, colleges or universities, as well as to assist with the cost of books and supplies.

All payments are sent directly to the school.

Enrichment Scholarship: \$100 - \$2,500

Intended for youth who participate in activities that inspire creativity and enhance learning. The enrichment scholarship award helps 7^{th} to 12^{th} grade students with low to medium income who demonstrate financial need to achieve their dreams.

Scholarships can be used for artistic endeavors, specialized summer camps or programs, and more. *College credit courses in High School are not eligible.*

Awards may be used for enrollment fees and/or supplies only. All payments are sent directly to vendors.



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Scholarship Criteria

It is the policy of United Way of Long Island and the DREAMS for Youth Advisory Board to consider all qualified candidates without regard to race, religion, national origin, gender, sexual orientation or disability. Each applicant is notified of the Board's determination. Funds are distributed directly to the vendor for the enrichment scholarship and to the selected college/university or vocational school for the academic award.

Applicant and parent/guardian signatures indicate that all information contained in the application is complete, factually correct and honestly presented. If any information is found to be false, this may result in the forfeiture of the scholarship award.

Awards are granted at the discretion of the Board and supervised by the United Way of Long Island. It is the responsibility of the scholarship award recipient to submit reports at the end of the activity for which the scholarship was received.

For academic scholarships, grade reports must be submitted at the end of the semester and continued funding for the one-year duration of the scholarship will be contingent upon the applicant receiving a grade of B or better **and** receipt of the grade report and tuition bill.

United Way of Long Island maintains the anonymity of the applicants and does not share personal information, including names, addresses or social security numbers with any outside parties, including the DREAMS for Youth Advisory Board. United Way of Long Island reserves the right to terminate scholarships at any time.

All scholarships are for one year only.

Applicants are not eligible for repeat scholarships.

Students competing for the DREAMS Scholarship must meet the following criteria:

Applicants must reside on Long Island and attend a Middle or High School in Nassau or Suffolk County.

For Academic Scholarships, applicants must be enrolled in 12th grade.

For Enrichment Scholarships, applicants must be enrolled in 7th to 12th grade.

Applicant must demonstrate financial need for academic and enrichment scholarships.

Academic Scholarships require a copy of the FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR) and a copy of the most recent tax return (first 2 pages only) for parents or guardians.

Enrichment Scholarships require a copy of the most recent tax return (first 2 pages only) for parents or guardians. These documents must be submitted along with the application.

Application Deadline: Friday, April 19, 2019

All materials must be mailed together and postmarked by
April 19, 2019
Late applications will not be accepted

Applicants will be notified of their status in mid to late June. Checks will be distributed upon receipt of the student's official tuition bill from their respective institution that includes the school name and address and the student's name and student ID number.
