# Sunshine Statement - Chapter 231, Laws of 1975

President Quackenbush read a statement that advance notice of this meeting, as well as the Agenda, had been distributed in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 231, Laws of 1975 (Sunshine Law).

The following items for the Work Session discussion were:

#### 1. Ad Advertising

Mr. Klein introduced the idea of Friends of Music or Parents of Athletics selling ad space on District property. The purpose would be to fund student activity costs, music, sport, etc. To help students meet the financial demands of their chosen activity. Discussion took place including:

#### Legal aspects

Mr. Green advised that this is a difficult issue legally. Only the BOE has the power by law to authorize placement of advertisements on District property and to decide what is allowed.

Clubs cannot raise funds through advertisements on Board property & keep the funds in their control.

A "thank you" sign for sponsors was suggested instead.

The BOE could likely delegate the right to solicit advertisements to another entity, with ultimate control over the advertisements exercised by the Board, although there is no explicit authority to do this.

The proceeds from advertisements would have to be deposited in the Student Activities Account and the use would be at the discretion of the District/Principal, etc. In any case there should be a Board of Education Policy to guide this if this is pursued further.

Given the legal issues involved this plan cannot move forward as currently proposed.

The Administration was asked to look into how other Districts handle advertising programs. Suggested Contacts: Wayne, Lyndhurst, Ramapo (legal issues) and Northern Highlands.

#### **Audience Comments**

# 1. Resolution Authorizing Competitive Contracting for Engagement of Construction Manager for 2014 Referendum Projects

WHEREAS, the Fair Lawn Board of Education ("Board") has determined that it should engage the services of a construction manager to oversee contractors engaged for work on multiple construction projects approved in a December, 2014 bond referendum ("the 2014 Referendum Projects"); AND

**WHEREAS**, due to the nature of construction management work, the Board has determined that it will be in its best interests to utilize the competitive contracting procurement procedures permitted under *N.J.S.A.* 18A:18A-4.1 *et seq.*; **AND** 

**WHEREAS**, the Board may utilize competitive contracting procurement procedures to engage a construction manager, so long as this method of procurement is approved by the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services ("the Division") pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 18A:18A-4.1 (k);

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 18A:18A-4.1(k), that the Board's Business Administrator seek approval from the Division to use the competitive contracting procurement procedures for the purpose of engaging a construction manager for the 2014 Referendum Projects; **AND** 

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board hereby authorizes the use of competitive contracting procurement procedures to engage a construction manager to manage the 2014 Referendum Projects if use of such procedures is approved by the Division.
