WHEREAS, Ms. Tashjian, performed diligently above and beyond her classroom duties to involve students in numerous activities related to their individual growth and development as well as broadening their understanding and appreciation of the English curriculum;

**RESOLVED**, that the Board of Education extends its sincere appreciation for the many years of service rendered by Ms. Jo-Ann Tashjian and wishes for her good health and happiness in her retirement; **AND BE IT FURTHER**

## S2. Payment Authorization for Superintendent's Merit

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Administrative Code [6A:23A-3.1(10iv)] requires the Board of Education to approve a Resolution certifying that a specific Qualitative Merit criterion for the Superintendent has been satisfied; AND

WHEREAS, the Superintendent's Merit Provisions were previously Board approved at the August 28, 2014 Public Board Meeting and submitted to the County Office of the New Jersey Department of Education; AND

WHEREAS, the Executive County Superintendent approved the submitted Merit Provisions on September 19, 2014; AND

WHEREAS, the Qualitative Merit Goal #1 called for a change in the district practice of providing speech-language services due to the increase in the number of students with severe disabilities; AND

WHEREAS, throughout the 2014-2015 school year, speech language services will be provided to K-12 students through the utilization of a new 3 to 1 Service Delivery Model, which will provide three weeks of direct service intervention each month and one week of indirect/consultative service intervention; AND

WHEREAS, the intention of the new model is to align therapeutic services with curriculum and social language goals of the classroom, and special education and/or general education classroom teacher objectives for generalization of skills; AND

WHEREAS, the merit of this goal is that we expected this model to provide the Speech Language Pathologists with scheduled/manageable opportunities for participation in indirect activities that would provide increased benefits (including some that they were previously not able to provide/follow-up) that support the implementation of students' educational programs and to support students in the least restrictive environment in their general education classes; AND

WHEREAS, we have exceeded the expected benefits of this implementation and will document this success to the Board of Education at the scheduled June 1, 2015 public meeting presentation, as well as the attached list of achievements; NOW THEREFORE BE IT,

**RESOLVED**, upon the approval of the Executive County Superintendent, the Fair Lawn Board of Education approve a Merit payment in the amount of \$4,187.00 to the Superintendent.

# S3. Payment Authorization for Superintendent's Merit

**RESOLVED**, upon the approval of the Executive County Superintendent, the Fair Lawn Board of Education approve a Merit payment in the amount of \$5,527.50 to the Superintendent.

Phase 1-Physical Condition Survey: a preliminary physical needs assessment and building condition survey will be performed. A professional engineer and/or registered architect will provide an overall review of the existing building including the building exterior, building interior, structural, mechanical, electrical, sprinklers, ADA issues and roofing systems to determine if they are adequate to support the existing programs. LAN will also review the sites at each facility for any items of concern related to the site. This survey will also review the existing structure and note any deficiencies that may be obvious.
