The Steering Committee has met a few times and reviewed each of the DPR's required for QSAC, showing evidence of the district's performance, Item #S4 on the agenda is requesting the Chief School Administrator and President of the Fair Lawn Board of Education to execute the declaration page further attesting to the accuracy of the SOA.

Alternate Proficiency Assessment (APA)

Mr. Watson said that 17 students that didn't take the PARCC took APA and spoke of what it was and how it was administered.

Mr. Watson mentioned the idea of having a PARCC Parent Academy Night for parents to help them interpret the test scores.

He also spoke of the Accuplacer Test for students at risk of not graduating due to opting out of the PARCC or other qualifying tests.

Ms. Lacatena spoke about the Basic Skills Kindergarten Program and said that the parents were invited to attend an explanation of the program on October 19 or 20, 2015. The program is set to start on October 26, 2015.

Mrs. Dell'Aglio, principal of Westmoreland School presented the 1st copy of the Westmoreland Newspaper which she hopes will keep the community informed of the construction happenings at Westmoreland. Each month different classes will contribute to the paper.

Mr. Watson said that every week meetings are held to keep all the key people involved in the construction project up to date. He said as it stands today, the project is on target and will stay that way barring any unforeseen circumstances or bad weather.

2015 NJASK Science Data Analysis

By Ronald Durso, Ed.S. District Science Supervisor

Longitudinal Data - NJASK 4

Data from the 2015 Science NJASK 4 indicates that the total student population in Fair Lawn continues to perform well in comparison to our DFG. Our proficiency percentage across the district was 96.3% vs. 95.5% in our DFG and 90.6% in the state. This represents an increase continual increase in proficiency since 2013. Despite some bumps over the course of the past 10 years, this also indicates an increase from a proficiency of 90.8% in 2006.

Similar trends exist when data from our regular student subgroups and our special education student subgroups are examined. Our LEP (Limited English Proficient) subgroup outscores our DFG by a substantial margin of 95.9% vs. 70.9% in our DFG and 54.8% in our State. This trend has also increased over the past 8 years from 80% proficient in 2007.

School Comparison Data - NJASK 4

All Fair Lawn Elementary Schools have scored very high on the NJASK 4 during 2015. Our range of proficiency rates are between 93.6% at Forrest to 100% at Milnes. 100% of the regular education students at Forrest were proficient on the NJASK.

Longitudinal Data - NIASK 8

Data from the 2015 Science NJASK 8 indicates that the total student population in Fair Lawn continues to perform well compared to our DFG. Our proficiency percentage across the district was 89.9 vs. 85.5% in our DFG and 77% in the state. This represents an increase continual increase in proficiency since 2011.

Our regular education subgroup also outperformed our DFG 95% proficient vs. 91.8% proficient. Since 2008, our proficiency percentages have been in the mid to high 90s. Our special education sub-group has also outperformed our DFG over the past 8 years. In 2015, our proficiency percent was 67.5% vs. 53.2% in the DFG. Our LEP subgroup was 62.5% proficient vs. 48.8 proficient in the DFG.

School Comparison Data - NJASK 8

Our proficiency rate at both middle schools was higher than the DFG and substantially greater than the state. At Memorial 85.6% of our students were proficient; at TJ, 90.5% were proficient. This is compared to an 85.5% proficiency in our DFG and a 77% proficiency in the state.

Using Data to Drive Professional Development & to Drive Instruction

NJASK data is reviewed and analyzed by the science supervisor and grade 8 science teachers at department meetings. Analysis of this data has demonstrated the need to move toward a spiraled curriculum. Historically, our students have done better in the physical science clusters on the NJASK and have found difficulty on some of the life science sections. Life science is taught in grade 6 and reviewed in grade 8. Physical science is taught in grade 8. Analysis has also led to a greater push in middle school toward application style assessment questions on tests, quizzes and labs.

NJASK data is reviewed and analyzed by the science supervisor and members of the elementary school science committee when the opportunity arises. The elementary science committee is developing the vision for the new NGSS aligned science program. NJASK data, when analyzed by school, can help to determine the greatest areas of need for support if an elementary school science specialist is a possibility in the future.
