WHEREAS, the Fair Lawn Board of Education deems it in the public interest to enter into a Shared Services Agreement with the Borough of Fair Lawn pursuant to *N.J.S.A.* 40A:65-1, *et seq.*, to permit the Borough to utilize the services of Aramark Management Services, L.P. for provision of custodial and management services to the Borough under the terms of Aramark's Service Agreement with the Board for the 2020-2021 school year;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Fair Lawn Board of Education approves the Shared Services Agreement with the Borough of Fair Lawn, on file in the office of the School Business Administrator, for provision of custodial and management services to the Borough of Fair Lawn by Aramark Management Services, L.P. on the terms contained in Aramark's Service Agreement with the Board of Education, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board President and Secretary are authorized and directed to execute the Shared Services Agreement on behalf of the Board.

R. Approval of RFP - Custodial and Management Services

WHEREAS, a committee was established to evaluate the proposals and rank the proposals in accordance with the weighting criteria set forth in the request for proposals; AND

WHEREAS, the committee has issued a report which evaluates and ranks the proposals in accordance with the weighting of criteria set forth in the specifications and presented a recommendation; AND

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the report and accepted the recommendation of the committee on which proposal should be accepted; AND

WHEREAS, the Board has concluded that the proposal submitted by Aramark Management Services, L.P. (hereinafter referred to as "Aramark") is the most advantageous to the School District, price and other factors considered; NOW,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, based upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the School Business Administrator and the review committee, that the Board accepts the proposal submitted by Aramark and awards the custodial and management services contract to Aramark for the 2020-2021 through 2024-2025 school years in the following amounts:

2021-2022 school year - \$2,447,668.94

2022-2023 school year - \$2,521,099.01

2023-2024 school year - \$2,596,731.98
