B. Award of Fair Lawn Interscholastic Athletics Streaming Concession

WHEREAS, the Fair Lawn Board of Education has determined that it is in the best interest of the School District to award a qualified vendor an exclusive license to provide internet streaming broadcasts of District athletic and potentially other select events; **AND**

WHEREAS, the terms of such an award meet the definition of a "concession" under *N.J.A.C.* 5:34-9.4; AND

WHEREAS, there is a public need to award the concession in order to make District athletic events widely available to interested students, staff, parents, and other members of the public, especially during the current public health emergency but also in the future, to encourage school spirit, support of the District's athletic program, and to foster a sense of community; AND

WHEREAS, the benefits to pupils, parents, and the public from internet availability of athletic broadcasts manifestly outweigh any risks arising from such award; AND

WHEREAS, the District's Superintendent of Schools, School Business Administrator, and Athletic Director have recommended award of the concession to the *NFHS Network* School Broadcast Program, powered by 2080 Media, Inc. d/b/a/ PlayOn! Sports ("PlayOn"); **AND**

WHEREAS, the total costs to the Board in connection with the concession will be \$2,500; AND

WHEREAS, the total revenue estimated to be received by the Board during the term of the concession contract is approximately \$4,000; AND

WHEREAS, the concession will include provision to the Board of two Pixellot cameras, software, and related equipment systems and broadcast of District events over the NFHS Network; **AND**

WHEREAS, the concession award will include an exclusive irrevocable license during the term of the concession to reproduce, perform, transform, and distribute the content recorded, the total value of which is indeterminable at this time due to the numerous variables involved, but is reasonably projected to be well below the bid threshold of the Public School Contracts Law ("PSCL"), and the total monies to be received by the Board are below the quote threshold of the PSCL; AND

WHEREAS, upon investigation the District's Administration has determined that solicitation of quotations is in any event impracticable as the particular combination of services, broadcast network, equipment, and software provided, affiliation with the National Federation of State High School Associations and widespread and growing adoption by many school districts in New Jersey and throughout the nation is unique to PlayOn, and the District has been unable to identify any vendor providing a comparable range of goods and services at a comparable price; AND

WHEREAS, in consideration of the above factors, the award of the concession is based upon the most advantageous price and other factors;

NOW THEREFORE, in accordance with the foregoing, it is hereby

RESOLVED, that the Fair Lawn Board of Education hereby awards a concession for a term of five years to the *NFHS Network* School Broadcast Program, powered by 2080 Media, Inc. d/b/a/ PlayOn! Sports, in accordance with the terms identified above and in the contract between the Board on behalf of Fair Lawn High School and PlayOn, on file in the office of the School Business Administrator, and the Board hereby ratifies and approves the said contract.

C. Authorization for the Use of Competitive Contracting for Telecommunications Services

WHEREAS, the Fair Lawn Public School District recognizes the need for complying with the New Jersey purchasing laws for obtaining the most competitive and responsive bid for goods and/or services; AND

WHEREAS, Pursuant to NJSA 18A:18A-4.1 et seq., the Board may procure specialized goods and/or services through Competitive Contracting; AND

WHEREAS, the Fair Lawn Public School District desires to contract for telecommunications services as contemplated by NJSA 18A:18A-4.1(d) ; **AND**

WHEREAS, the Fair Lawn Public School District encourages free and open public competition for goods and services; AND

WHEREAS, the Fair Lawn Public School District recognizes the need for obtaining the most competitive and responsive proposal for goods and/or services;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Fair Lawn Public School District, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, authorizes the School Business Administrator to initiate the competitive contracting process, pursuant to 18A:18A-4.3, to contract for telecommunications services.

D. Addendum to South Bergen Jointure Commission for Transportation Service Agreement

WHEREAS, the South Bergen Jointure Commission ("SBJC") and the Fair Lawn Board of Education ("the Board") are parties to a 2020-2021 agreement for SBJC, an approved Coordinated Transportation Service Agency, to coordinate transportation services for the Board's students; **AND**

WHEREAS, due to the current public health emergency, a number of school districts were required to close for health-related reasons, with several of those school districts continuing to remain closed until further notice; AND

WHEREAS, under N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-9, if a school district is subject to a health-related closure for a period longer than three consecutive school days as a result of the current public health emergency, a jointure commission shall continue to make payments under the terms of a contract with a contracted service provider as if the school facilities remained open,**AND**

WHEREAS, because of school closures as a result of the public health emergency, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-9, the SBJC is obligated to continue payments to its transportation service providers during the 2020-2021 school year; **AND**

WHEREAS, SBJC's commitment to continue payment to those contracted transportation service providers is contingent upon the Board's continued payment to SBJC; **AND**

WHEREAS, the SBJC is desirous of amending the terms of the Agreement to memorialize the Board's responsibility to continue its payment obligations to the SBJC to ensure full compliance with N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-9.

NOW, WHEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE as follows:

- 1. For the term of the 2020-2021 school year, if schools are closed and/or operating under virtual or remote instruction as a result of the current public health emergency, thereby not requiring transportation services for the Board's students, the Board shall continue to make payments under its Agreement with SBJC, as if the school facilities remained open, for SBJC to pay its contracted transportation service providers in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-9.
- 2. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement not addressed herein shall remain in full

force and effect.

REFUNDING BOND ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BOROUGH OF FAIR LAWN IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY PROVIDING FOR THE REFUNDING OF (A) ALL OR A PORTION OF ITS OUTSTANDING REFUNDING SCHOOL BONDS DATED MAY 1, 2012; (B) ALL OR A PORTION OF ITS OUTSTANDING REFUNDING SCHOOL BONDS DATED NOVEMBER 19, 2013 AND (C) ALL OR A PORTION OF ITS OUTSTANDING SCHOOL BONDS DATED MARCH 3, 2015 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$17,000,000 AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF REFUNDING SCHOOL BONDS OF THE BOARD TO EFFECT SUCH REFUNDING

WHEREAS, on May 1, 2012, The Board of Education of the Borough of Fair Lawn in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Board" when referring to the governing body and the "School District" when referring to the territorial boundaries governed by the Board) issued \$6,515,000 aggregate principal amount of tax-exempt Refunding School Bonds, Series 2012 (the "2012 Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, on November 19, 2013, the Board issued \$9,950,000 aggregate principal amount of tax-exempt Refunding School Bonds, Series 2013 (the "2013 Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, on March 3, 2015, the Board issued \$10,677,000 aggregate principal amount of tax-exempt School Bonds, Series 2015 (the "2015 Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the current interest rate environment may enable it to realize going-forward debt service savings for property taxpayers residing in the School District through the issuance by the Board of Refunding School Bonds (the "Refunding School Bonds") to refund (A) all or a portion of the \$3,355,000 aggregate principal amount of the outstanding 2012 Bonds maturing on or after February 15, 2023 (the "2012 Refunded Bonds"); (B) all or a portion of the \$4,885,000 aggregate principal amount of the outstanding 2013 Bonds maturing on or after February 15, 2024 (the "2013 Refunded Bonds") and (C) all or a portion of the \$7,282,000 aggregate principal amount of the outstanding 2015 Bonds maturing on or after March 1, 2024 (the "2015 Refunded Bonds" and collectively with the 2012 Refunded Bonds and the 2013 Refunded Bonds, the "Refunded Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, in efforts to realize such taxpayer savings, the Board now desires to adopt and enact a refunding school bond ordinance (the "Refunding Bond Ordinance") authorizing the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$17,000,000, the net proceeds of which shall be used to refund all or a portion of the Refunded Bonds in accordance with their terms.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BOROUGH OF FAIR LAWN IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS: **Section 1.** The Board is hereby authorized to refund (A) all or a portion of the 2012 Refunded Bonds; (B) all or a portion of the 2013 Refunded Bonds and (C) all or a portion of the 2015 Refunded Bonds. The 2012 Refunded Bonds may be redeemed on and after February 15, 2022, at a redemption price equal to par, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption. The 2013 Refunded Bonds may be redeemed on and after February 15, 2023, at a redemption price equal to par, plus accrued interest to the 2015 Refunded Bonds may be redeemed on and after February 15, 2023, at a redemption price equal to par, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption. The 2015 Refunded Bonds may be redeemed on and after March 1, 2023, at a redemption price equal to par, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the purpose set forth in Section 1 hereof, the Board is hereby authorized to issue not to exceed \$17,000,000 aggregate principal amount of School Bonds, all in accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61 through 62.

Section 3. An aggregate amount not exceeding \$350,000 may be allocated from the aggregate principal amount of the Refunding School Bonds to pay for the aggregate costs of issuance thereof, including, but not limited to, bond insurance premiums, underwriting fees, official statement printing fees, public advertisement expenses, refunding verification agent fees, refunding escrow agent fees, bond counsel fees and other expenses in connection therewith.

Section 4. The purpose of the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds is to realize net present value interest cost savings for property taxpayers residing in the School District ("net" meaning savings after payment of all costs of issuance of the Refunding School Bonds). Applicable State requirements mandate that such net present value interest cost savings equal at least 3% of the principal amount of the Refunded Bonds. In addition, the issuance of the Refunding Bonds shall comply with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 5:30-2.5, including that within 10 days of the date of the closing on the Refunding Bonds, the Business Administrator/Board Secretary shall file a report with the Local Finance Board within the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs setting forth (a) a comparison of the Refunding School Bonds' debt service and the Refunded Bonds' debt service which comparison shall set forth the present value savings achieved by the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds; (b) a summary of the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds; (c) an itemized accounting of all costs of issuance in connection with the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds and (d) a certification of the Business Administrator/Board Secretary that (i) all of the conditions of section (b) of N.J.A.C. 5:30- 2.5 have been met and (ii) a resolution authorizing the issuance of the Refunding School Bonds, adopted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61.5(b), was approved by a twothirds vote of the full membership of the Board.

Section 5. The supplemental debt statement required by N.J.S.A. 18A:24-16 and N.J.S.A. 18A:24-61.4 has been duly prepared by the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough of Fair Lawn and has been filed in the Office of the Clerk of the municipality and in the Office of the Business Administrator/Board Secretary of the Board as of the date of approval of this Refunding Bond Ordinance and a complete executed duplicate has been filed in the Office of the Director and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Board is increased by the authorization of the Refunding School Bonds in this Refunding Bond Ordinance, and will be decreased by the amount of the Refunded Bonds.

Section 6. If the Refunding School Bonds are issued on a federally tax-exempt basis, the Board covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under Section 103(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, of the interest on all Refunding School Bonds issued under this Refunding Bond Ordinance.

Section 7. This Refunding Bond Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption hereof.
