**How this book stands out:** Hoodie Rosen is an Orthodox Jewish teen who recently moved to an unwelcoming new neighborhood. He is conflicted when he begins to have feelings for Anna-Marie. With anti-Semitic attacks plaguing the town, Hoodie must figure out what really matters.

**The Girl in the Lake** by India Hill Brown

How this book stands out: When Celeste and her cousins arrive at their grandparents' lake house, they experience flickering lights, the sound of footsteps in the attic, and the appearance of a girl who looks just like Celeste. This horror novel, which mixes in a bit of history, will keep readers engaged and on the edge of their seat.
