On motion by Jacob Charvat and seconded by Brad Schiermeyer, the board voted 5-0 to approve the agenda with the following additions: Item 10a) Approve Resignations; Item 12d) Boiler Issues at CPHS – Claflin.

Approve Agenda

On motion by Jacob Charvat and seconded by Tami Schepmann, the board voted 5-0 to approve the minutes of the Jan. 14, 2019 board meeting and the special meeting minutes on Jan. 28, 2019.

Approve Minutes

The following patrons addressed the board in Public Forum: Amy Smith, Leland Francis, Don Siemsen and Harold Siemsen. Amy Smith read her resignation letter as pre-school teacher, and thanked the board and the district for the opportunity to teach for USD 112; Leland Francis also thanked the board. The concerns of Don Siemsen and Harold Siemsen included the following: school minutes and Parliamentary Procedure at board meetings; purpose of Executive Sessions at board meetings; date of school district's consolidation; water bills at CPHS – Claflin, and boiler expenses.

Public Forum Jerry Bieberle arrived at 6:20 p.m.

On motion by Brad Schiermeyer and seconded by Tami Schepmann, the board voted 6-0 to approve all invoices in the amount of \$187,583.78.

On motion by Cherlyn Maier and seconded by Jerry Bieberle, the board voted 6-0 to approve the treasurer's report as presented.

Approve Treasurer's Report

The board of education reviewed the cash summary report and the bank balances were reconciled with the treasurer's report as of Jan. 31, 2019.

On motion by Cherlyn Maier and seconded by Jacob Charvat, the board voted 7-0 to approve the resignations of Amy Smith, as pre-school teacher, Carol Near as high school counselor, and Roby Heitschmidt as social studies teacher, effective at the end of this school year.

The board opened discussion on the future of USD 112 and building plans which included capital outlay needs and the number of attendance centers. They also discussed the possibility of forming community committees to help with district future needs and to review all options going forward. The option of possibly hosting a district-wide community meeting for further discussion on the future of the district and sharing ideas as a whole was discussed.

Board Discussion on USD 112 Future Needs

By consensus, the board agreed to have a district-wide community meeting, with Gary Sechrist, from KASB, as the moderator, for further discussion on the district's future.

Consensus Agreement

Mr. Clark gave an update on the four district-owned busses that have continuously broke down and have been in for many repairs. These buses need major repairs and Mr. Clark, along with Jamie Zink, transportation supervisor, have discussed these issues with the dealership. The dealership representative acknowledged that these particular bus engines have had issues and they are willing to work with the district to resolve the problems. Their proposal would be to replace the motor in one of the buses at no cost to the district, along with trading in the remaining three buses on three used buses, with approximately 50,000 miles. This proposal would include a 4-year lease payment of approximately \$20,000, which would cover all three buses. All of the buses would come with a 5-year warranty.

Discussion on bus issues

By consensus, the board agreed to move forward on the bus proposals and bring all the information and costs back to the March meeting for consideration and possible approval.

Mr. Clark gave an update on the progress of the capital outlay needs of the district for 2018-2019 and 2019-2020.

Mr. Clark opened discussion on the current issues with the boilers at CPHS – Claflin. Currently, the building is being heated by the one, large boiler, with the two smaller ones needing repairs.

On motion by Jerry Bieberle and seconded by Jacob Charvat, the board voted 7-0 to approve the proposal from DCS for boiler repairs at CPHS – Claflin, in the amount of \$21,791.00

On motion by Tami Schepmann and seconded by Brad Schiermeyer, the board voted 7-0 to take a 5-minute break at 8:40 p.m. and return to the regular meeting at 8:45 p.m.
