From the Desk of Rabbi Monczyk:

#### פרשת תרומה

Over the next few weeks, we go through all of the specifics and construction of the Mishkan, and the intrinsic details involved with each and every aspect of it. When it comes to the most important part, the Aron, the Mechilta says that although the Torah prescribed the use of gold in the construction of most of the vessels of the Mishkan, other metals may be used if gold is unavailable. This applies to all vessels except for the keruvim, the angelic baby faces on top of the Aron. The obvious question is, what is different about this most important item that Chazal were insistent that it should only be made from pure gold? All the other vessels; the spoons, pans, utensils, and even the menorah were allowed to be made from other metals. There must be something extra unique about the keruvim. Rav Meir Shapiro zatzal, founder of the Daf Yomi, provides us with a beautiful and telling explanation, and one that applies to every Jewish home in every generation. The keruvim, with their faces formed like those of children are symbolic of the young and impressionable children. Our children are our most precious asset and therefore in addition to caring for their physical needs, the most important consideration that every parent must ensure is the need to provide them with an uncompromising Jewish education. Indeed, the position of the keruvim on top of the holy Aron symbolizes the concept that our children's Torah education is to be placed in the highest regard. Perhaps this is the reason why no other metal besides a pure, unadulterated gold may be used when it comes to teaching children Torah and supporting Jewish education for our youth. Only our very best - "golden"- efforts will suffice.

This takes a tremendous amount of mesirat nefesh both at home and in school. The messages our girls learn will shape their future and the future generations to come. Let's make sure our messages and priorities are given over in a way that shows what is important to us in life, and in a manner that shows the beauty and simchat hachaim of our special mesorah.

Chodesh Adar is a time to be really happy and with ראש חדש occurring on Tuesday we started the week off with Crazy Hat day. Then on Wednesday morning the Pre-School assembled together for a special show presented by Mr. Meish Goldish. The girls really enjoyed his funny tricks and songs. We continued with our Purim preparation and this week we learned about the four special mitzvot associated with Purim. We even learned a song to help us remember these mitzvot:

There are four mitzvot that we must do

Mishloat Manot, food and presents we send.

Additionally, our Hebrew vocabulary has also been increasing with words such as:

Even though our room is filled with Purim activities we must not forget the weekly Parsha. In this week's Parsha, פרשת תרומה, Hashem commands us to build a משכן, a special place, in which Hashem can dwell. Moshe wondered where all the materials needed for the building would come from after all the בני ישראל were in the desert. Hashem told him that each person should give a gift towards the משכן. The gift could be something gold, silver, copper, cloth, skins, oils or stones and everyone was allowed to give whatever he could afford. Then all the donations were pooled together so that no one person could claim that a specific part of the משכן was made from his individual gift. Each person participated equally in this special mitzvah.

We learned that the לוחות were kept in the ארון קדש which was placed in the משכן. We also learned that Hashem was compared to a shepherd. Just as a shepherd sets up his tent close to his sheep in order to watch them, Hashem wanted to have a dwelling place near the Jewish people. We also learned that although we don't have a משכן in order to בית כנסת בית כנסת בית כנסת ברכת, ארון, שלחן in order to remind us to stay close to Hashem


