.4 School COVID-19 Update - Superintendent, Lyle Bayley

Lyle Bayley reported the Elementary and Middle School students have been receiving face-to-face instruction Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. Wednesday delivery of instruction is on-line. The High School went to on-line instruction for a few days due to number of COVID-19 cases and exposed students.

Currently ALL High School students are receiving instruction face-to-face with A & B day attendance Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday. Wednesday delivery of instruction is online.

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Bayley reported number of cases have decreased with information the district has received from Southwest District Health. If COVID-19 cases remain low with the boards permission to move the High School to four (4) days a week of face-to-face instruction Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday. Wednesday delivery of instruction would be on-line. Bayley presented to the board a policy Emmett School District approved.
