### .1 Retain & Recruit Teachers Committee Members

Jaris Lewis, Teresa Wilson, Stacy Wescott and Gina Ziegler presented a power point "Teacher Retention and Recruitment".

<u>Purpose:</u> To propose, plan and coordinate new initiatives and engage in creating and participating in recruitment and retention activities for Fruitland School District employees. <u>Goal:</u> To provide the School Board Trustees, Superintendent Lyle Bayley and Administration, with ideas and recommendations on initiatives to service the recruitment and retention of teachers and staff in Fruitland School District.

- Hire Behavior Interventionist.
  - Post-pandemic behaviors are extreme and beyond teacher expertise.
  - Overall classroom learning is suffering.
  - ALL schools need support for unacceptable behaviors.
  - Behavior room needed for chronic offenders in all buildings.
- Hire Teacher Instructional Coach.
  - Position eliminated due to budget in 2009.
  - Assist & support new teachers.
  - New Curriculum.
  - Data Collection and testing coordinator (RTI) needed for struggling students.
- Hire additional Para educators.
- Hire additional elective teachers.
- Staff Morale
  - Spirit Fridays Wear Fruitland shirt with jeans (spirit gear).
  - Need more non-contact time for teachers to plan, grade and communicate with parents.

- Suggestions for Improvement.
  - Transportation
  - Split Bell Schedule
  - 4-Day school week

The committee presented 4-day school week schedules from the following school districts:

- Homedale
- Payette
- New Plymouth (start date 2022-2023)

The trustees thanked the committee for their hard work, time, research, and presenting their concerns tonight.

Trustees recommendation would be <u>not</u> to approve a 4-day school week at this time. Having a 4-day school week isn't going to resolve the issues they mentioned tonight. Trustees expressed concern approving the 4-day school week tonight for the 2022-2023 school year wouldn't have enough time to make sure it is done right.

Chairman Frye recommended at the February 14th board meeting a new committee be established with a couple board members, staff and administration to work on the issues that were presented at tonight's meeting.
