## Form A RESOLUTION OF SCHOOL BOARD AUTORIZATION LOAN

RESOLVED that we, the members of the School Board of the School District of Bangor, Wisconsin, duly assembled in meeting according to law this 18<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2015 approve and authorize that application be made by the President and Clerk of the School Board to the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands for a State Trust Fund loan in the amount of One Hundred Fifty Thousand And 00/100 Dollars (\$150,000) for the purpose of financing heating and cooling upgrade to middle/high school. The loan is to be repaid within 10 years from the 15<sup>th</sup> day of March preceding the date the loan is made. The loan is payable in annual installments with interest at the rate of 3.25 percent per annum, from the date of making the loan to the 15<sup>th</sup> day of March next and thereafter annually as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there is levied on all the taxable property within the School District of Bangor a direct, irrepealable annual tax sufficient in amount to pay the principal and interest on the loan as they become due.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we, the members of the School Board of the School District of Bangor, Wisconsin, do intend to use our exemption authority within the purview of Section 67.12(12)(e)2g, Wisconsin Statutes, for the application of this loan.
