The Galva-Holstein Board of Education met in regular session on Monday, June 11, 2018 in the Schaller Crestland library with the following board members present: Grant Aschinger, Evan Johnson (7:08 pm), Don Kalin, Dave Kistenmacher, Heather Pribble, Matt Wittrock and Jamie Whitmer.

Administration: Superintendent Wiebers and Principals Mozer, Richard and Warnke.

Visitors present: Ashley Hansen, Melissa Hansen and Jane Schomaker.

Call to order: 7:05pm

Motion by Aschinger, second by Kalin to approve agenda as presented. Motion carried 6-0.

Johnson entered the meeting (7:08 pm).

Ashley Hansen addressed the Boards regarding the rules for participation in extracurricular events when practice is missed due to doctor appointments.

Motion by Kalin, second by Kistenmacher to approve minutes for May 14, 2018 regular meeting as well as special meeting and work session on May 30, 2018. Motion carried 7-0.

Motion by Kistenmacher, second by Johnson to approve bills as presented. Motion carried 7-0. Included in this motion is permission for Business Manager to pay June vendors as needed through the end of June 30, 2018. Kistenmacher reviewed bills prior to meeting.

Motion by Pribble, second by Kalin to approve financials for May 2018 as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Elementary principals reported on their building goals, whether met or exceeded, in the areas of reading and math, as well as established goals for the 2018-2019 school year. Principal Warnke reported on the high school reading and math goals too, as well as a target he had set for tardiness in the high school. Additional methods for identifying atrisk students and providing interventions have been implemented; better communication with those students' parents will be a goal going forward. Warnke also apprised the boards of options available to the districts for public broadcasting of board meetings and other events as The Cube, which both districts have been using, has been bought by another company.

Motion by Johnson, second by Kistenmacher to accept resignation submitted by Chad Hustedt as boys' golf coach, pending finding a suitable replacement. Motion carried 7-0.

Motion by Pribble, second by Kalin to approve resignation of Emily Stracke as assistant cross country coach. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Aschinger, second by Kistenmacher to approve continuing the agreement to share the school business official with River Valley as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Kalin, second by Johnson to approve AEA Purchasing Agreement for the 2018-2019 school year. Motion carried 7-0.

The President of the Board called up for consideration the Resolution to Consider Continued_Participation in the Instructional Support Program which requires that a public hearing be held on this proposal.

Director Kistenmacher introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption. Director Pribble seconded the motion to adopt. The roll was called and the vote was:

AYES: Aschinger, Johnson, Kalin, Kistenmacher, Pribble, Wittrock and Whitmer.

NAYS: None

The President declared the Resolution adopted as follows:

RESOLUTION

TO CONSIDER CONTINUED PARTICIPATION IN THE INSTRUCTIONAL SUPPORT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has approved a five (5) year finance plan, which anticipates the level of funding that will be possible to continue the current level of services and to fund the ongoing programs of the School District; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors wishes to consider Continued participation in the Instructional Support Program as provided in Iowa Code sections 257.18 through 257.27; and

WHEREAS, the authorization for the Instructional Support Program will expire on June 30, 2019; and

WHEREAS, this resolution sets forth the proposal of the Board of Directors, including the method that will be used to fund the program; and

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of a public hearing must be published: NOW, THEREFORE, it is resolved:

- 1. The Board of Directors wishes to consider Continued participation in the Instructional Support Program as provided in Iowa Code sections 257.18 through 257.27, for a period of five (5), commencing the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020.
- 2. The additional funding for the Instructional Support Program for a budget year shall be determined annually, and shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of the total regular program district cost for the budget year and moneys received under Iowa Code section 257.14 as a budget adjustment for the budget year.

3. Moneys received by the District for the Instructional Support Program may be used for:

Any general fund purpose, however, moneys received by the district for the instructional support program shall not be used as, or in a manner which has the effect of, supplanting funds authorized to be received under sections 257.41, 257.46, 298.2, and 298.4, or to cover any deficiencies in funding for special education instructional services.

- 4. The Instructional Support Program shall be funded by instructional support state aid and a combination instructional support property tax levied annually upon the taxable property within the School District commencing with the levy of property taxes for collection in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020, and instructional support income surtax imposed annually, the percent of income surtax to be determined by the Board for each budget year to be imposed upon the state individual income tax of each individual income taxpayer resident in the School District on December 31, 2019, and each year thereafter.
- 5. The Secretary is authorized and directed to give notice of a public hearing to be held in the high school media center, Galva-Holstein Community School District, Holstein, Iowa on July 9, 2018, 7:00 o'clock P.M.
- 6. Following the public hearing the Board intends to take action on the question whether to consider continued participation in the Instructional Support Program.

Motion by Pribble, second by Kalin to approve the revised Good Conduct Policy with an amendment to include if a student reduces penalty by seeking treatment and follow-up care, the reduction in penalty will be revoked if student doesn't complete or continue treatment prescribed by substance abuse counselor. Motion included that if anyone is currently under the old policy, revised policy will be applied to original penalty. Motion carried unanimously.

Wiebers updated the board regarding communication with architect and potential daycare at the Holstein site. Tours of gyms and industrial technology spaces will be arranged with area districts within the next two weeks.
