Mr. Clark reported on the following:

- A Gave a legislative update and reviewed the various proposed bills that are being discussed in Topeka that will affect school finance, and the possible increase in the Base State Aid Per Pupil (BSAPP) over the next five years.
- B Reviewed the 5-year Capital Outlay plan and discussed the projects that have been completed, along with the cost of some of the future projects for the 2018-2019 school year.
- C Explained the state funding for the 4-year-old At-Risk program and the number of "slots" that were finally approved for the district. He explained that the district may be able to obtain additional slots, from other districts that were not needed.
- D Discussed the current water issue at CPHS and there had been a valve leaking, which caused the high water bill. That will be repaired. He also discussed the possibility of installing a sprinkler system, with a timer and possibly drilling a water well to help reduce the water usage.

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On motion by Tony Zink and seconded by Tami Schepmann, the board voted 5-0 to go into Executive Session at 7:35 p.m. for 20 minutes, with Greg Clark and John Sherman, to discuss the building administrators' evaluations, pursuant to the non-elected personnel exception under KOMA, and return to open meeting at 7:55 p.m.

On motion by Tony Zink and seconded by Tami Schepmann, the board voted 5-0 to renew the contracts of Toby Holmes, CPHS Principal, Jane Oeser, CPMS and CPES Principal, and Kenroy Wilson, PreK-12 Principal at Wilson through the 2019-2020 school year.

John Sherman addressed the board and discussed a patron's request to purchase a small parcel of land, north of CPES – Holyrood, on the east side of main street, north of the creek. This land amounts to roughly $3/10^{th}$ of an acre, and is excess property that is not needed by the district. The patron, Lana Stueder, offered to pay \$300 for this parcel of land, which will benefit the district, since it will save on mowing maintenance.

RESOLUTION NO. <u>2019-3-1</u>/

WHEREAS, Unified School District No. 112, Ellsworth County, State of Kansas, ("the District") is the owner of the following described tract of real estate located in the City of Lorraine, Kansas:

A tract of land in the SE ¼ Section 10 T-17S R-10W of the 6th Principal Meridian, Ellsworth County, Kansas, described as follows:

COMMENCING at the intersection of the South line of Nassau Avenue and the East line of Main Street in the City of Holyrood, Kansas; THENCE east along the South line of Nassau Avenue on an assumed bearing of N 90° 00'00'E, one hundred forty four feet (144.00'); THENCE S 00° 07'36 "E parallel with Main Street, one hundred twenty feet (120.00') to the POINT OF BEGINNING.

THENCE continuing S 00° 07 '36 "E parallel with Main Street, twenty five feet (25.00); THENCE N 90° 00 '00 "E parallel with Nassau Avenue, fifty six feet (56.00); THENCE N 00° 07 '36 "W parallel with Main Street, twenty five feet (25.00); THENCE S 90° 00 '00 "W parallel with Nassau Avenue, fifty six feet (56.00) to the POINT OF BEGINNING.

Tract contains 0.032 acres more or less and is subject to all applicable R/W, easements, and restrictions (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Property is not used by the District for any educational purpose and creates expense for the District and having to mow and maintain the Property; and

WHEREAS, the District can save the District and its taxpayers the cost of mowing and maintaining the Property by disposing of the Property in an expeditious manner; and

WHEREAS, Lana Stueder, a neighbor adjoining the Property is interested in purchasing same for the sum of \$300.00; and

WHEREAS, Lana Stueder has paid the cost of the survey of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the District may transact all District business it deems appropriate in the performance of its duties to maintain, develop, and operate, its schools; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the District has title to, and the care and keeping of, all school properties; and

WHEREAS, the Property is no longer needed by the District, and is excess property which may be disposed of in accordance with K.S.A. 72-3216 by a recorded affirmative vote of not less than a majority of the members of the USD No. 112 Board of Education at a regular meeting; and

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 72-3216 provides that the Board of Education may dispose of the District's property in such manner and upon such terms and conditions as the Board deems to be in the best interest of the District, and that conveyances of school buildings and properties shall be executed by the President of the Board and attested by the Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of Unified School District No. 112 Ellsworth County, State of Kansas deems it in the best interest of the District to sell the Property to Lana Stueder.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of Unified School District No. 112, Ellsworth County, State of Kansas, that the District sell and convey to Lana Stueder, "as is and where is" and without warranties of title, in exchange for the sum of three hundred dollars and zero cents (\$300.00) the following described Real Estate:

A tract of land in the SE ¼ Section 10 T-17S R-10W of the 6th Principal Meridian, Ellsworth County, Kansas, described as follows:

COMMENCING at the intersection of the South line of Nassau Avenue and the East line of Main Street in the City of Holyrood, Kansas; THENCE east along the South line of Nassau Avenue on an assumed bearing of N 90° 00'00'E, one hundred forty four feet (144.00'); THENCE S 00° 07'36 "E parallel with Main Street, one hundred twenty feet (120.00') to the POINT OF BEGINNING.

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Tract contains 0.032 acres more or less and is subject to all applicable R/W, easements, and restrictions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the District convey the Property to Lana Stueder, a single person by a quit claim deed from the District, executed by the President of the Board of Education of Unified School District No. 112, Ellsworth County, State of Kansas and attested to by the Clerk, and that said conveyance be delivered upon compliance with the terms of this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the President of the Board of Education of Unified School District No. 112, Ellsworth County, State of Kansas with the attestation of the Clerk be authorized to execute and deliver said Quit Claim Deed on behalf of the Board; and

ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 112, ELLSWORTH COUNTY, STATE OF KANSAS, on this 11th day of March, 2019, by all 7 Board members voting in favor of said Resolution and no votes opposing said Resolution.
