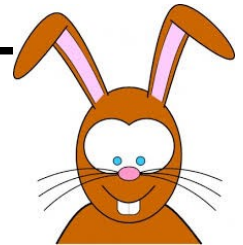

## FROM THE NURSE

Head lice are a constant battle. These critters have been around since Egyptian times. They are a huge nuisance but do not cause any medical concerns. It is the responsibility of each family to monitor their own child's hair frequently and you have the right to check any children who come into your home. The following guidelines are good to follow:

- Please inspect your child's head for the possibility of head lice. Look for small silvery nits (eggs) fixed to the hair shaft, similar in appearance to dandruff, but not easily removed. Where nits have hatched, live lice may be seen. Any nit found ¼ inch or greater, from the scalp will be dead. If nits or lice are found, please call your physician regarding appropriate treatment. Your child should stay home from school until lice have been treated.
- Follow the directions for any medication carefully. Cream rinse and conditioners can decrease the effectiveness of the treatment.
- During the school year, it is a good idea to check your child's head weekly and when he or she complains of having an "itchy" scalp.
- Talk to your child and remind him or her not to share or borrow combs, brushes, hats or scarves.
