Life can be cruel; we may be hurt. But pleasant memories we must make Of loneliness, and shattered dreams We must ourselves forsake.



The tablecloths were native, handmade quilts with multicolored silk flower center pieces in brass or crystal containers flanked by candles. The garden facing the dining room had the facade of a colonial house with a brass eagle and the number 1776 above the door. The Sophomores served as waiters and waitresses and wore uniforms of young colonial ladies or of continental soldiers complete with George Washington cotton wigs.




STUDENT COUNCIL
