The Natural State Chautauqua: Women's Suffrage and Prohibition

Description: The Natural State Chautauqua is in its 19th year of production and is a first-person interpretation of American history by those who shaped the nation. Scholars are chosen from across the country to spend three days in South Arkansas to present the characters. After doing a first-person character presentation, they then take questions, as the character. Finally, they step out of character to answer questions, as the scholar behind the historical figure. This is unique learning experience, as one becomes emerged in the past and learns firsthand about America's history.

- Saturday, June 8, 2019 from 7 to 8:30 pm – **H. L. Mencken**, an American journalist and satirist, will enlighten and entertain visitors about prohibition and the suffrage movements.

After-School Care

Description: After-school care is provided for Kindergarten through sixth grade students who are enrolled on either campus in the school district. Students attending school at Norphlet are provided with bus transportation to Smackover Elementary School each afternoon. Students participating in after-school care receive a snack, homework help, and outside playtime when the weather permits. After-school care on early dismissal days is also provided for an additional \$5 fee. Pre-registration is required before a student can enroll in the after-school care program. Conscious Discipline is used to support the social, emotional development of students while Creative Curriculum is utilized to support the intellectual development of students. Breakfast, lunch, and snacks are provided to all students.
