Western Reserve FFA Alumni Scholarship

The Western Reserve FFA Alumni will sponsor a scholarship for a graduating senior from Western Reserve High School. The amount and number of scholarships will be determined annually by the WR FFA Alumni. The listed criteria permits the scholarship open to any graduating senior pursuing an agricultural related career.

- First consideration will be given to a graduating high school senior pursuing an agricultural related career including: Production Agriculture, Agronomy, Agricultural Business/Communications/ Marketing, Food Service / Production or Natural Resources.
- Second consideration will be given to a current college student pursuing a degree in the Agriculture Industry, as listed above.
- Student must be graduating from high school with at least a 2.0 GPA and include a copy of their ACT results with the application. Current college students must have a GPA of at least 2.0 to be eligible.
- Scholarship money will be awarded to the recipient upon submittal of grades for their first college semester and proof of courses registered for their second semester. Payment will be made to the school the applicant is attending. If the scholarship is not claimed by January 15th of the following year, the scholarship will be forfeited.
- An alternate recipient will be selected and scholarship money will be awarded to the alternate in the event the winner does not fulfill the requirements or does not claim the money.
