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West of the Month Harvest of the Month

We have been invited to take part in a Harvest of the Month pilot program. This program promotes the use of seasonal and local foods in our menus, and it highlights a different product each month. We are provided with marketing tools to increase the purchasing, consumption, awareness, appreciation and acceptance of Maine grown products.

Currently, most of our produce comes from Native Maine, which purchases primarily from Maine Farmers, with a very few Vermont farmers in the mix. Our regular Food Service provider also has a 46-page list of products that come from either Maine or the New England region. (While the New England region is not considered local for the purposes of this program, it is considered local in other programs.)

The Harvest of the Month Program gives us access to promotional materials, HOM artwork, Maine farmers, and technical assistance. In addition, for every \$3.00 that we spend at a farm or a farmers' market, we will get \$1.00 back (up to \$1,000.00).

Our spring HOM items will be Maine Dairy for April, Maine Wild Blueberries for May, and Maine Leafy Greens for June.

Bills

Currently, there are at least five bills related to school nutrition that are being discussed, worked on, or voted on:

- 1. Allow for the Recovery and Redistribution of Food in Public Schools
- 2. Eliminate the Reduced Category for NSLP
- 3. Maine DOE shall Create an Online F&R
 Price Meal Application that is available to all
 schools
- 4. Implement Breakfast After the Bell Model in Schools where at least 50% of the Students are Eligible for F&R Price Meals

- 5. Implement the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) at Risk Afterschool Programs in Schools Where at least 50% of the students are eligible for F&R priced meals
- 6. Prevent Food Shaming in Public Schools

Participation

With the Breakfast in Classroom After the Bell being a current topic, I have been looking back at our numbers in RSU #34. Since 2016 we have changed the entire LMS over to Breakfast in the Classroom After the Bell. At OTES we offer several breakfast opportunities, including Breakfast in the Classroom After the Bell for Pre-K through Grade 2. VRS has just implemented Breakfast in the Classroom After the Bell for all grades. All three of these schools have shown a significant increase in participation as a result.
