Continuing the Work of Professional Learning Communities

CHS continues in Year 3 of the work of PLCs with Solution Tree consultants.

CMS continues in Year 2, the work of PLCs.

TIER I-Core Grade Level Instruction

Selected to participate in the State PLC Cohort professional development: Building Principals, Superintendent, & Board Member

Asst. Principals attended training in the PLC work with Solution Tree consultant, Janel Keating at the SE Educational Cooperative.

Solution Tree consultant contracted to work with K-6 staff to identify essential reading standards and begin the work of the PLC.

Purchased HQIM for English in 7th through 12th with funds from a DESE SOAR grant (\$160,000).

Personal coaching for the MCLs and Principals by Public Impact in how to coach teachers to deliver effective instruction. (Opportunity Culture)

Year long professional development for the Literacy MCLs by Great Minds to support effective core grade level instruction of Wit & Wisdom (K-8th grade).

Great Minds math consultant onsite to support core grade level instruction in Eureka Math (K-5th Grade).

Added two MCL positions at CMS to support novice teachers in all core content areas through the use of Federal funds.

TIER II-Interventions

The District is working alongside SE Education Cooperative Specialists to improve student achievement by improving Tier I, core grade level instruction as well as Tier II and Tier III interventions that address the individual learning needs of the students in all content areas with a focus on reading.

Focus: Increasing Small Group Instruction

Tier II is likely to involve small groups of students with similar learning needs who work daily with a teacher using a specific instructional practice or program.

New for 22-23:

Hired a K-2 Reading Interventionist using funds from a DESE SOAR grant. She joins a group of interventionists in the District that provide Tier III interventions for struggling readers.

Tier 3 consists of highly targeted individualized and intensive interventions and typically consists of between 1% and 5% of students.

TIER III Interventions

New for 22-23:

Trained the Special Education teachers to use *Barton's Reading System* with students identified with characteristics of dyslexia.

Used federal funds to purchase professional development and materials to implement an intervention program for math called *Primary Numeracy Intervention Program* that focuses on early numeracy intervention. This intervention program takes teachers on a mathematical journey from the first day of kindergarten to the beginning of third grade. The program is designed to find the deficits that students have within state standards and provide teachers with the resources that are needed for an intense math intervention .
