#### **ORDINANCE NO. 2011-05**

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING TAXES FOR THE USE AND SUPPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF TULIA, TEXAS AND PROVIDING FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2011-2012; PROVIDING FOR THE TIME AND MANNER OF PAYING THE AD VALOREM TAXES LEVIED.

#### BE IT ORDANINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TULIA, TEXAS:

- Section 1. That there is hereby levied and there shall be collected for the use and support of the municipal government of the City of Tulia, Texas, the year Two Thousand and Eleven (2011) upon all property, real, personal, and mixed within the corporate limits of said City subject to taxation, a tax of thirty-six and eighty-four eight-nine hundredth cents (\$.368489) on each One Hundred Dollars (\$100)based on 100% assessed valuation; for the maintenance and support of the general government and for the operation of the City Government to be placed in the General Fund 100% of the total amount received.
- Section 2. It is hereby made the duty of the City Treasurer and every such person collecting money for the City of Tulia to deposit to the General Fund of the City.
- Section 3. The ad valorem taxes herein levied shall become due on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of October, 2011, and may be paid up to and including the following January 31, 2012, without penalty, but, if not sooner paid, such taxes shall become delinquent on the following day, February 1, 2012. Penalties, interest and the recovery of costs and expenses on and related to a delinquent tax shall be as provided by Chapter 33 of the Texas Property Tax Code.
- Section 4. All taxpayers shall be allowed discounts for the payment of taxes prior to January, 2012, said discounts to be allowed under the following conditions (a) three percent (3%) discount on all ad valorem taxes due, if such taxes are paid during the month of October, 2011; (b) two percent (2%) on all ad valorem taxes due, if such taxes are paid during the month of November, 2011; (c) one percent (1%) on all ad valorem taxes due, if such taxes are paid during the month of December, 2011.
- Section 5. The taxes herein levied shall be a first and prior lien against the property upon which they are assessed and the said first lien shall be superior and prior to all other liens, charges, and encumbrances, and this lien shall be attached to personal property to the same extent and with the same priorities as to real estate.

Section 6.

Section 7. Should any part of this ordinance be declared invalid, for any reason, that invalidity shall not affect the remainder of this ordinance.

# ORDINANCE NO. 2011-05

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 3.13 ENTITLED "PERMIT FEES, BONDS AND INSURANCE" OF CHAPTER 3 ENTITLED "BUILDING REGULATIONS", OF THE TULIA CITY CODE ADOPTED SEPTEMBER 21, 2004, AS AMENDED, BY AMENDING THE PERMIT FEES AND ADDING PERMIT FEES; CONTAINING A REPEALING CLAUSE, A SAVINGS CLAUSE AND PROVIDING FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE.

# NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TULIA, TEXAS:

Section 1. That Article 3.13 entitled "Permit Fees", of Chapter 3 entitled "Building Regulations", of the Tulia City Code adopted September 21, 2004, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### (e) Roofing permits.

- 1. A roofing contractor must register with the City and provide a \$10,000.00 bond and pay \$10.00 for a license every year.
- 2. Only licensed contractors may take out the roofing permit. The permit will be \$50.00.

Exception. A homeowner may sign a permit and accept liability for the contractor.

#### (f) Sprinkler/Irrigation permits

Minimum Permit Fee for the first 75 heads
 Additional heads over 75

 \$ 0.50 per head

All sprinkler/irrigation systems are subject to being inspected every two (2) years with a permit fee of \$25.00 per each reinspection.

#### (g) Waiver of permit fees

The City shall retain the right to waive any permit fees because of the size of project, for positive impact on economic development in and around the City and for other reasons as the

City may from time to time determine.

(h) State licenses. Each contractor who applies for a permit must have such current state licenses as may be required for the type of work such contractor will perform and shall maintain in such license in force and effect at all times during performance of the work.

#### (i) Bonding requirements.

When applying for a permit herein above set forth and required, each contractor will be required to provide a \$10,000.00 bond acceptable to the City.

#### (i) <u>Liability insurance requirements.</u>

- (1) Any plumbing, electrical or building contractor seeking a permit hereunder, must provided evidence to the City of liability insurance acceptable to the City in the amount not less than the amount required by state law or regulation or \$250,000.00 per occurrence, whichever is more.
- (2) Any roofing contractor seeking a permit hereunder, must provided evidence to the City of liability insurance acceptable to the City in the amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence.

#### (k) Contractor ID Card.

Each contractor receiving a permit as required herein shall all pay \$10.00 for a Contractor ID Card for each agent and employee who will be appraising, bidding or contracting with homeowners, businesses or other citizens of the City for said contracting services.

#### (1) Exceptions.

- (1) A homeowner may contact the City and sign a request that any contractor be relieved of the bonding, liability insurance and Contract ID Card requirements set forth herein, which request the City may grant in its discretion to the extent that such request does not attempt to relieve the contractor of requirements that are required by state law or regulation and is otherwise permitted by law.
- (2) The City may, in its discretion, waive bonding, liability insurance or Contractor ID Card requirements for local contractors who have done business in Swisher County, Texas, for at least two (2) years to the extent that such request does not attempt to relieve the contract of requirements that are required by state law or regulation and is otherwise permitted by law
- <u>Section 2</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be, and the same are hereby repealed.
  - <u>Section 3</u>. The invalidity of any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase,

word or words shall not invalidate any other part of this ordinance. It is the intention of the City Council in enacting this ordinance that the provisions are separable, and no provision hereof shall become inoperative or fail by reason of the invalidity of any other provision.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force on passage and approval.

# ORDINANCE NO. 2011-06

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING OF SUBSECTION (b) OF SECTION 6.02.013 ENTITLED "REMOVAL OF GARBAGE; CHARGES FOR REMOVAL" OF ARTICLE 6.02 ENTITLED "GARBAGE AND OTHER REFUSE", OF CHAPTER 6 ENTITLED "HEALTH AND SANITATION", OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, 2004, CITY OF TULIA, TEXAS, AS AMENDED, BY ADDING PARAGRAPH (5) FOR CHARGES FOR GARBAGE COLLECTION SERVICE FOR SWISHER COUNTY RESIDENTS; CONTAINING A REPEALING CLAUSE, A SAVINGS CLAUSE AND PROVIDING FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ORDINANCE.

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TULIA, TEXAS:

Section 1. That Subsection (b) of Section 6.02.013 entitled "Removal of garbage; charges for removal" of Article 6.02 entitled "Garbage and Other Refuse", of Chapter 6 entitled "Health and Sanitation", of the Code of Ordinances, 2004, City of Tulia, Texas, as amended, is hereby amended by adding thereto paragraph (5) to provide for charges to Swisher County Residents who desire to utilize City garbage collection, which paragraph (5) will read as follows:

- (5) Swisher County Residents: Swisher County residents may contract with the City to utilize containers designated by the City for disposal of their residential garbage and trash for a fee of \$25.00 per month, such use of the containers and residential garbage and trash disposal to be in accordance with Section 6.02.005 of the Code of Ordinances, 2004, City of Tulia, Texas, as amended.
- <u>Section 2</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be, and the same are hereby repealed.
- Section 3. The invalidity of any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, word or words shall not invalidate any other part of this ordinance. It is the intention of the City Council in enacting this ordinance that the provisions are separable, and no provision hereof shall become inoperative or fail by reason of the invalidity of any other provision.

<u>Section 4</u>. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force on passage and approval.
