Bulk Trash Pickup Schedule

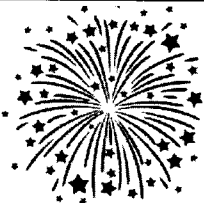
Bulk trash is picked up monthly *based on your regular trash day*. Find your trash day to see when your monthly Curbside Bulk Pick-Up will occur:

Your Water Usage, Online!

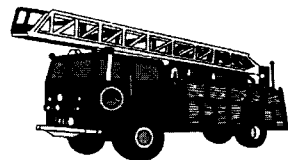
The City is currently in the process of upgrading our infrastructure by replacing our water meters with new Smart meters. These new meters transmit readings daily and provide a more detailed picture of water usage and possible leak issues. In addition to being able to pinpoint when a leak started, these new meters can show how much water is used in household use and irrigation. As we work to install these meters across the City, we will be reaching out to account holders as their meters are installed to give them the information they will need to log in and access their readings online. New Fire Engine

The Choctaw Fire Department recently purchased a 2023 Sutphen Fire Engine. The new truck has 1,500 gallons a minute pump, 1,000 gallons of water capacity, and 30 gallons of foam. The unit carries 3,000 feet of fire hose and has a full complement of rescue saw and battery powered vehicle extrication equipment. The apparatus will respond on a variety of emergencies including structure fires, vehicle fires, motor vehicle accidents and medical emergencies.

(CEDA): **As Needed****Storm Water Quality Tips**

If you apply too many lawn fertilizers or pesticides, especially before a heavy rain storm, a lot of it may be washed into nearby storm drains and then our waterways and water bodies without treatment.

Fertilizers promote growth and decay of algae that use up oxygen in the water, that fish need to survive. Pesticides in stormwater runoff directly affect the health of aquatic organisms and human health, if ingested. Sweep excess fertilizers off of pavement and concrete so they can't wash into our streams and rivers, and always use pesticides at the concentration amount recommended by the manufacturer.

**Roofing Permits**

Attention Choctaw Residents, homeowners, and builders. It's that lovely time of year again when hailstorms seem to appear more frequently. Hail damage is not a fun thing to experience especially when it can dislodge shingles and cause damage that can lead to leaky roofs. Development Services has a roofing permit that we issue to contractors whenever your roof may need shingle replacement or re-decking, due to damage, insurance related purposes, or to create a property facelift. Our mission is to make sure the roofing contractor you hire is currently certified with the Oklahoma Construction Industry Board, and that they are supplying the correct information for installation. A common thing that roofers tend to do when re-decking is overloading the weight of the joists, which can lead to long term structural damage. The Building Inspector will review calculations against the International Residential Code (IRC) minimum requirements. Fees may also be assessed for contractors caught doing work without a permit, which can ultimately fall back onto the homeowner. Our roofing permit can be obtained on our website mychoctaw.org under Building Division Forms.

Choctaw Library

The Choctaw branch of the Metropolitan Library System is located at 2525

Muzzy Street. You may still pick up using curbside service. Many programs are available online in addition to pre-made kits. The Choctaw Library offers a broad array of services, including public access computers, free WiFi, copy/scan/fax/printing services, programs and events for all ages, and a robust local collection of physical materials for all interests and tastes. Additionally, the library features a large meeting room that can be booked and used by the public, as well as large covered outdoor patio spaces that can be used by the public, weather-permitting.
