# 9. Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Baker informed the board that the November 13 in-service day focused on K-8 training for DRA II and Fasttmath. Faculty in grades 7-12 worked on calibration of faculty scoring of local district assessments.

Dr. Baker reported the State Department of Education team for site visits on new school applications toured facilities on November 14 at Fairfield Primary, Albion and Clinton Elementary Schools. The Department is reviewing 81 applications for new school construction in this round. The Department staff indicated they hope to have results for local districts in March 2018.

Dr. Baker stated that the November 28 early release will focus on curriculum work and development of alternative assessments.

The Superintendent read a letter from MSAD #49 Teacher Association President Elon Firmage informing the board of the Teacher Association's intent to bargain a renewal of the collective bargaining agreement.

Principal Wedge reported the Benton running club is in its 8<sup>th</sup> week. Students track their miles and receive incentives after a few weeks. Benton's average daily attendance is 96% for the first quarter.

Principal Lee reported Albion kindergarten and first grade Thanksgiving celebration will be held November 21. The kindergarten class will be making Native American costumes and the first graders will be making and wearing pilgrim costumes to the feast – parents are welcome and encouraged to attend. Fairfield primary collected non-perishable items and donated to the Interfaith Food Pantry.

Principal Gordon noted 41 Clinton students from grades 4-6 made honor roll for the first quarter.

Principal Boynton reported the JHS Advanced Art students held 'Paint Night' an annual fund raiser for a trip to the Boston Museum of Fine Arts. The LJHS Theater Company is set to perform 'I Hate Shakespeare November 17 and 18. The LJHS Lego Robotics team will be traveling to Spruce Mountain in Jay for their first qualifying competition.

#### 10. Other Business

Mr. Liberty stated that he is concerned about observing numbers of teachers at Lawrence Junior and Senior High School leaving with students at the end of the school day. He also questioned students parking in the teachers' parking lot.

Ms. Rudnicki noted that the scheduling group will meet Monday, November 20 at 3:00 at the LJHS Multi-Purpose Room.
