 - a. Discussions with our students indicate a pervasive problem exists in our bathrooms.
 - b. CDC data from 2020 for High School Students
 - i. 19.6% reported current e-cigarette use.
 - ii. 38.9% of high school students reported use in the past 20/30 days.
 - iii. 22.5% of high school students reported daily use.
 - iv. Health impact is not completely known.
 - v. Nicotine is not the only hazard.
 - c. Weekly vandalism continues to occur within the high school bathrooms.
 - d. We have assigned Bathroom observations by faculty and administration every 30 minutes.
 - e. Utilization of Smart Pass and Camera's help us to find the point of vandalism.
 - f. The Virkada Sensor would be located in every bathroom at the High School.

- 1. Utilizing our current camera system, the Smart Pass System, frequent observations by staff and the Verkada Sensor we will be able to improve the environment within our Restrooms.
- 6. As per Missouri State University/ West Plains
 - a. Starting in the 2022-23 school year, students wanting to take a Dual Credit class in Math or English will have to take the ACT <u>before</u> the class begins. Both subjects have an ACT minimum score requirement.
 - English Comp (writing) Min 18 ACT in Reading
 - College Algebra Min 22 ACT in Math
