Most Valuable Player Award for both Indoor Track and Outdoor Track & Field and was selected to attend HOBY and Girls State. We are so proud to be able to offer college classes to our students. In addition to their high school diploma, many of our graduates receive a college transcript with transferable credits. We are fortunate to have official academic partnerships with three prestigious institutions:

- Syracuse University
- Alfred University
- SUNY Environmental Science & Forestry (ESF)

Several of our teachers have been credentialed through these institutions to teach specific college classes at our school. The content, workload, and exams for these classes mirror those taken by college students at the sponsoring institution. Our students have the opportunity to enroll in these college classes and earn official college credit during their standard school day. We all know how expensive college can be and we are proud that the tuition costs for these classes are covered through a grant.

MasterMinds consists of four NYS Leagues: Albany, Buffalo, Rochester and Syracuse. Mount Morris is one of nine schools participating in the Rochester league. "Basically, MasterMinds is like a traveling jeopardy team. We have both a JV and Varsity team, each with 6 players. 4 students play at a time and answer questions regarding a little bit of everything such as movies, music, art, TV, science, math, English, geography, history, current events, etc. We like to have one student from each team focus on one category. When the game is being played, the students have to buzz in individually to answer a toss-up question. If the one student gets the question correct, they move on to a bonus question where the whole

team can discuss in order to get the answer. Each question is worth ten points! There are 16 tossup questions in a game", said Master-Minds Coach, Mrs. Kobel. These quiz bowl-style academic competitions are for high school



students and meets consist of matches between our team and teams from other schools. We would like to recognize Emily Mike (class of 2023) who is currently leading the Rochester Varsity League with 195 points!
