- Student Council held a blood drive on April 15<sup>th</sup> and collected 21 units.
- The Schuyler Scholar Bowl team ended its season at 12-17 on the year. Though the record was below .500, many of the losses came against larger schools in very

- competitive tournaments. Against schools of our size, we held our own. The team competed in districts this past Saturday and made it to the semifinals before being defeated by Knox County. Cody Miller was named to the district all tournament team. Earlier in the season, Blake Wallace and Cody Miller earned spots on the all conference team.
- Students went with Mrs. Blessing on Friday, March 29th to Kirksville. They stopped at the Human Body Simulator Lab, Cadaver Lab, Reptile Lab, Planetarium, and Microbiology lab. The stops were all informative and many of them included hands on activities that our students would not otherwise get to see. Thanks for supporting this trip every year. Mrs. Blessing
- Small Engine Class Members Become Certified
  This past school year the Schuyler Ag department began a Small Engine class, this is the
  first year of the class, and all 15 members have recently completed all the training
  required to become Stihl Certified Technicians
- On April 17, Mr. Kaden, Mr. Miller, 32 juniors, and several Rotarians attended the annual Rotary Government Day in Jefferson City. Upon arrival, the group spent some time in the Missouri Historical Museum, were given a tour of the Whispering Gallery by Representative Sharpe's staff, sat in on a speech by Senator Blunt to the Missouri House of Representatives, toured the Missouri Supreme Court building, and had lunch while Judge Paul Wilson of the Missouri Supreme Court spoke. Students enjoyed the day and felt that the chance to see where our state government operates rewarding. The government students would like to thank the Schuyler County Rotary Club for funding the lion's share of the trip.
- The Schuyler Varsity Scholar Bowl team, consisting of senior Lindsey Chitwood, junior Blake Wallace, and freshmen Nathan Leslie, Joey Mountain, Weston Byrn, and Haleigh Fowler, completed its season by losing in the district tournament at Putnam County on April 6. The team finished its season with a record of 4-12 and notched victories over Canton, Putnam County, Salisbury, and Harrisburg twice. Blake Wallace was the only player with varsity experience coming into the season. Blake did an excellent job of captaining the team. He earned a spot on the 1st Team All Conference and All District teams. This very young team did take its lumps throughout the course of the season as it played teams with rosters laden with juniors and seniors. Schuyler's young players, though, became more experienced and confident with each passing game. At the Lewis and Clark conference tournament, Nathan Leslie was the only freshmen to be a member of the All Conference team by earning a spot on 2nd Team All Conference. With Blake returning as a senior next season, a year of experience for the soon to be sophomores, and a good crop of 8th graders becoming freshmen, I expect good things for next year's Scholar Bowl team.
