Gibraltar School District Technology Agreement

The GSD Technology Agreement applies to the use of all technology owned by Gibraltar School District used on or off school property. Staff and Students are expected to follow these procedures when using any technology owned by the district. All technology is owned by the district and provided to staff and students for a period of time deemed appropriate by the administration to perform appropriate and relevant school district work.

District Technology is to be used as a productivity tool for school-related business, curriculum enhancement, research, and communications. All users (staff, students/families) will act in accordance with applicable Board of Education Policy and Administrative Regulations when using the district's technology equipment, network, and related accessories.

Staff, students and parents/guardians must read and comply with the following conditions prior to being issued a device/equipment:

- 1. Users have reviewed and understand the district's Acceptable Use Policy and related Administrative Regulation, both of which are found on the school district's website, www.gibdist.net.
- 2. Users may not disrupt the educational process through non-educational, unsafe, or illegal use of the device.
- 3. Users must NOT attempt to alter any hardware or software or change the system configuration including network settings on any equipment assigned to them.
- 4. Users will use only district provided extensions, applications and software and should not modify, add, or remove any at any time.
- 5. Users must keep personal information about themselves confidential to only themselves. Staff and students may NOT give out passwords or other sensitive information.
- 6. Users are expected to prevent damage and theft to any device assigned to them and may be held responsible for breakage of their device. Students may not decorate any device in any way including stickers or drawings.
- 7. Users may be held personally and monetarily responsible for any loss or damage caused by intentional vandalism or negligence concerning assigned district electronic devices.
- 8. Users will not be held responsible for manufacturing defects or technical problems resulting from regular school-related use.
- 9. Users must provide access to any equipment and/or accessories they have been assigned upon the district's request.

The District reserves the right to update and/or modify these procedures at any time:

- ✓ I understand that all laptop/device computers, electronic devices, equipment and/or accessories provided are the sole property of the district and the use of any device, apps, and network activity are monitored closely and real-time.
- ✓ I will not install any additional software or change the configuration of the equipment assigned to me.
- ✓ I agree to return the equipment to the District in the same condition in which it was provided (excluding expected normal wear and tear) upon request from the District.
- ✓ I understand that I may be personally and monetarily responsible for any damage to or loss of any laptop/device computer, electronic devices and/or related equipment and accessories assigned to my student due to intentional vandalism or negligence.
- ✓ I understand that a violation of the terms and conditions set forth in this agreement, related policies, and/or the code of conduct may result in the restriction and/or termination of use of the district's Laptop/device computers, equipment and /or accessories. I also understand any violation of the terms of this agreement may result in loss of network privileges, loss of right to use the device, or appropriate discipline.

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Chromebook and Laptop Care Guide for GSD

To ensure their longevity and proper functioning of devices and laptops, it is important to take care of devices properly. This document offers practical steps for staff and students to maintain their devices/Laptops effectively.

Handling and Transport: Always transport your device in its protective case. When your device is out of its case, always carry the device with two hands, holding it on both sides of the device. Keep the device closed when transporting it to prevent any pressure on the screen. Avoid putting heavy objects on top of the device.

Cleanliness: If you wish to clean your screen, use a clean, soft microfiber cloth to wipe the screen, keyboard, and touchpad. Avoid using harsh cleaning agents or excessive liquid that can damage the device.
