#### PARKERS CHAPEL ELEMENTARY

#### 2019-20 SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Parkers Chapel School District reviewed the elementary school plan throughout the school year and submitted a report to the Parkers Chapel School Board during the April meeting. Along with the evaluation of the current plan, the board approved the 2019-20 draft plan. It will be updated and presented again in July for formal approval after the current school year's test data has been reviewed.

## Analysis of Students' Needs

In 2016-17, Parkers Chapel Elementary received a grade of B on the annual report card issued by the Arkansas State Department of Education. In 2017, 65.11 students in English Language Arts and 66.81 in Math were Exceeding or Ready. Of the targeted group, 55.65 in ELA and 57.39 in Math were Exceeding or Ready. The predicted overall ESSA Index Score is 79.02. The Weighted Achievement Score is 82.45. The Value Added Growth Score is 80.38. The School Quality and Student Success Score is 66.45. (See attachments) Student Engagement or attendance rate was 81.33. The area of greatest need is the number of students reading at grade level. In 2017, 54.31 or 126 out of 232 were reading at grade level and in 2018, 46.18 or 115 out of 249 students were reading at grade level according to the ACT Aspire results. The Science Achievement Score was 56.22 in 2017 or 131 out of 233 were Exceeding or Ready on the ACT Aspire.

## Student Supports and Evidence-Based Interventions Implemented

Literacy: A parapro assists during kindergarten and first grade DI reading instruction so the teachers can teach small groups. The parapro will use the Sonday System of teaching reading with the groups while the teacher teaches his/her reading groups in kindergarten. At first grade, reading groups will rotate between the teacher and para pro bi-weekly, so students receive double the reading instruction time. Students evaluated upon enrollment in kindergarten and all current elementary students test in May. The evaluation determines reading group placement for the following year.

At 3<sup>rd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> grades, the curriculum is Lucy Calkins Units of Study. Social Studies teachers use Wit and Wisdom reading curriculum to teach social studies standards.

Math: Parkers Chapel Elementary uses Eureka Math Curriculum. Each student has a Zearn account for practice and remediation. Khan Academy is a remediation tool used as well.

Science: National Geographic Science

## Professional Learning Required for Interventions

Teachers receive PD in August to teach the curriculum. Administrators continually monitor teacher and student progress throughout the year. Reading teachers will attend RISE training (SOR). Other elementary teachers will participate in RISE training in the future.

# <u>Implementation Timeline for Monitoring Intervention</u>

June & July – Students that fail a content area attend summer school

July – Students in grades 3-6, not scoring Exceeding or Ready on the ACT Aspire identified.

August – April – Students attend after school tutoring during the school year as determined by their score.

Quarterly – Interim ACT Aspire results identify additional students to attend after school tutoring.

## <u>Implementation Timeline and Procedures for Evaluation of Interventions</u>

Interventions evaluated after each NWEA test in K-2, after each DI test and after the ACT Aspire Interim test; teacher made tests, and any recommendations for back testing.

As required by law, dyslexia tests are administered.

#### Percent Tested: Source and Use of Enrollment

For percent tested and school/district achievement calculations, student enrollment files were downloaded from eSchool via TRIAND to establish the students expected to test. These files were downloaded May 05, 2017.

When students' test and enrollment records were matched by school and student state identifier, the demographic values from the enrollment files were used in ESEA calculations.

When a student had a test record, but a matching enrollment record was not found, the demographic values from the student's test record were used in ESEA calculations.

When a student had an enrollment record that did not match a test record, the demographic values from the student's enrollment record were used in ESEA percent tested calculations.

### School Achievement

The school achievement results in this report include students who completed a full academic year (not highly mobile) and completed a regular or alternate assessment. Students who were considered highly mobile were excluded from the calculations. All grades are included in the school achievement for each subject.

### State Percentage Achieving

The state percentage achieving is the state percentage of students achieving Ready or Exceeds levels on their summative assessments. These percentages include students who completed a full academic year (not highly mobile) and completed a regular or alternate assessment. Students who were considered highly mobile were excluded from the calculations.






