From April until the weekend of November 19 and 20 Rubbish and yard debris may be dropped off at the Lyndhurst Service Garage on Saturdays and Sundays from 11:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. This service is for RESIDENTS ONLY – proof of residency is required.

#### PAPER SHREDDING

The Fall Shredding Day will be Saturday, October 22 from 11:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.in the City Hall Parking Lot. FOOD DONATOINS WILL BE COLLECTED AT THIS EVENT

#### **COMPUTER RECYCLING**

Place your old Computer or other peripherals next to your recycling container on collection day to be picked up and recycled or bring to the Service Department Monday to Friday 7:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. or to weekend collection.

## From the Fire House

ur Department has once again completed hydrant painting across the City. Priority was given to new or replaced fire hydrants and then those hydrants that have been identified as needing repainting. Our hydrant painter returned from last year and she really enjoys the work and the interaction with residents when out in the community.

During this year's Home Day weekend, the Lyndhurst Firefighters Local 1676 will be staffing the BeerTent in the park during the entirety of the festival. Partial proceeds support various charities including Aluminum Cans for Burned Children (www.acbcohio.org) and Olivia's Dream (www.oliviasdream.org). There will also be a brief September 11 Remembrance Ceremony in front of the fire station at 09:59 which was the time the first building collapsed.

Lastly, a friendly reminder, as we will be coming into the fall season that all open burning requires a permit and approval from the Fire Department. Yard waste, including fall. Outdoor recreational fires must be in an approved fire pit or container with smoke not creating a nuisance.

## After five years of active planning,

the former Lyndhurst Fire Department bays were leveled to make way for a new fire station and the former office and dormitory spaces were renovated for other uses. ## From the Desk of Patrick A. Rhode, Chief of Police

#### **School Davs**

It's that time of year again, and with school back in session for some and getting ready to start for others, school buses will be packed with kids headed to and from school. Do you know when to stop for a school bus? School bus traffic laws are in effect for the safety of children or other passengers entering or leaving a school bus. Children often will be crossing the street at bus stops, so these laws are extremely important for their safety. In Ohio, school bus traffic laws vary depending on the size of the road.

On a road with fewer than four lanes, all traffic approaching a stopped school bus from either direction must stop at least 10 feet from the front or rear of the bus and remain stopped until the bus begins to move or the bus driver signals motorists to proceed.

If the bus is stopped on a street with four or more lanes, only traffic proceeding in the same direction as the bus must stop. To facilitate this law, children are dropped off on the same side of the road as their residences, so they won't have to cross the street.

Other school bus safety tips:

- Never pass a school bus on the right
- All school buses must stop before crossing railroad
- Never pass a bus at a railroad crossing
- Be aware of school zone signals and always obey the posted speed limits – we will heavily enforce school speed limits
- Leave a little early so you are not rushed as you travel. School bus drivers believing a motorist has unlawfully passed a stopped bus will - if possible - report the license plate number to the Lyndhurst Police Department. We will diligently attempt to determine the identity of the driver, and if the identity is established, the reporting of the license plate number by the school bus driver establishes probable cause upon which to issue a citation. Failure to establish the identity of the driver may result in us sending a warning letter to the registered owner stating that a motor vehicle registered to the owner was reported as having unlawfully passed a stopped school bus in The City of Lyndhurst.

Failure to stop for a school bus can add points to your license and can be punishable by fines up to \$500. You must appear in court for this violation, and the judge may suspend your driver's license for up to one year. A driver who injures a pedestrian while failing to comply with school bus safety laws can face both criminal charges and civil liability (i.e. medical expenses, lost wages, pain and suffering damages, etc.).

Please do your part and pay attention as to whether the wheels on the bus are going round and round, or not ... our children's safety depends upon it!

Safety Town is back! After a very long hiatus, Safety Town returned to The City of Lyndhurst in a collaborative effort between The City of Lyndhurst, the Lyndhurst Police & Fire Departments, The Lyndhurst Police Foundation, and the HillcrestYMCA.



The program's focus is to give students the tools to increase their awareness and make safe choices when it comes to road, bike, and school bus safety. It was a great experience for all involved and it allowed us to bring the police and community together in The City of Lvndhurst.

Everyone involved was able to take away something from our time together. We look forward to bringing this program back in 2023, with even more to offer and new friends to be made!

he South Euclid Lyndhurst School District is excited to begin the 2022-2023 school year with great expectations, and a continued eye on academic and co-curricular success. Meeting the overall social and emotional needs of students will also be a focus as we promote a safe, secure and encouraging learning environment. The last two years has taught everyone in education that a continual dedication to affirming students to be the absolute

best they can be, regardless of circumstances around them, must be a constant priority. To help ensure a successful school year, this article contains some of the nuances the community can expect from the South Euclid Lyndhurst Schools.

To help prepare students, and provide academic and co-curricular enrichment opportunities, the Arc Summer Learning Academy concluded its second year at the Greenview Intermediate and Middle School Campus. This summer learning flipped traditional summer school models, by offering supplemental academic programming to those interested in an engaging environment, taught primarily by South Euclid Lyndhurst Schools instructors. Students had the opportunity to learn in a classroom setting during the morning, participate in a transition block of time, and then enjoy some creative educational experiences in the afternoon. Summer Academy Principal Sylvia Marshall once again did a fantastic job of leading this summer initiative. The district firmly believes that extra educational opportunities provided will only serve to benefit our youngest students. Congratulations to everyone involved.

The continued implementation of an engaging, and rigorous three-Year Curriculum and Instruction plan will help to maintain our positive push towards enriched academic achievement. The district is pleased to report that after its first year of implementation, several instructional

focuses have been accomplished. Some of those milestones include the selection of a new math core curriculum resource, designed to provide heightened levels of mathematics rigor. In addition, iReady an educational evaluation tool, that provides diagnostic assessment, has been implemented in grades Kindergarten through eighth for Language Arts and Mathematics. The SEL School System has created an honors and accelerated Mathematics pathway and placement procedure to continue encouraging our top learners. An ACT prep course, to help ensure greater success for test-taking, has been created at Memorial Junior High and Brush High School. To monitor and evaluate the components of this three-year plan, a Curriculum and Instruction Task Force has been created, comprised of administrators and educators to promote progress and ensure success. Looking ahead, these subjects, along with a continued focus on elementary literary skills, K-8 mathematics, American Government, and African American History curriculum, will be future focuses.

Finally, the community is excited to welcome some notable new faces in new places throughout our buildings. We formally welcome Michael Fording to the role of Principal at Charles F. Brush High School. Mr. Fording brings more than 20 years of experience in education and nearly a decade in building leadership. Larraine Fuller, who previously served the district as Assistant Principal at Brush, has become the Principal at Memorial Junior High School. Matthew Bryan, formerly at Memorial Junior High, has become the fourth grade principal at Greenview Intermediate School. Be sure to say hello to these individuals!

oney, time to get up! You've got a busy day planned!" "Thanks Ma!" She's right, I'm goin' to help Pa take a big beef order to Mr. Baker's house in the Lyndhurst Park Estates. Pa says he's the head man at the Cleveland Plain Dealer and one of the first folks to settle in the new section of town. OOPS ... Pa's waitin' on me. I'd better get a move on.

Boy, what a chilly day, Homedays was so hot and muggy this year, it seems like forever ago! No matter, I still won the sack race and got a new baseball as my prize. Me, Harry Schaeffer and the Kebrdle boys are gonna' play "first bouncer-fly" when we get back.

There's Mr. Kneale and his family, pickin' their strawberry crop. The strawberries are everywhere throughout Lyndhurst. Same with the apple and pear trees. I love pickin' fresh fruit to eat while we walk.

Boy, Pa's truck rides so smooth down Richmond Road since they put the new bricks down. All righ t... there's the "Big Red" goin' up the interurban line. Here's Clubside road. Boy, there's lots of open fields. Wonder why they don't plant em'? Mrs. Scheuring, my teacher in the red schoolhouse says that Congressman Bolton and his wife, are responsible for the founding of both the "Park Estates" and Hawken School. A Mr. Collacott did the developing for them and right now there's only 12 houses in here. Mr. Collacott's house is first on the right, after you turn off Mayfield Road. Boy, these are fine houses. Mrs. Schuering says they're a "Dutch Colonial" design. I like the three roads they have and how they separate the Estates into two islands (as they like to call em'). It's neat and it feels different down here. Not at all like our farms up on the north side of town. Here, at Mr. Baker's house, the air smells damp and earthy from the woods and creek.

I hate to leave but Pa says it's time to go. He's got a couple of hogs, comin' in from out in Windsor and he has to get em', right quick. He says I can come back with him another day. "Don't forget, the boys are waitin' to play ball with you son!" "Oh yeah, thanks Pa!"

I think we'll play on Spencer Road since they paved it too. Pa's tickled pink that they named it after him. Boy, the first paved side street in Lyndhurst and it's got our name. I wonder if anybody in the future will realize that? The town sure is a-changin'. A few years ago, we were still Euclidville. Now we're Lyndhurst Village. Maybe someday there will be a historian, or someone who will write about our town and growin' up here. Boy, the stories I could tell em'!

Oh good, the boys, are waitin' for me. OH NO ... there's Marie Spiegel and Elsie Cain. THEY can't play ball! They're girls! But, come to think of it, Elsie is the one who knocked the cover off my old ball, so maybe I'll let her be on my team. Good thing I won my new ball at Homedays. I love autumn in Lyndhurst.


Our best advice is to:

- Know what program you are signed up for and for
- Know the price per mcf for gas or price per kwh for electricity you are paying. Those are listed on your bill along with the name of your supplier.

- 3. Do not share your personal information with any unsolicited caller.
- 4. Be very cautious with offers that sound "too good to be true".
- Review the fine print of any offer before you sign, especially cancellation fees.

FirstEnergy and Dominion Energy can provide you information if you have questions about the program in which you are enrolled or are considering signing up for. 



## Yard Waste & Leaf Disposal

riving around the city we continue to notice an abundance of yard debris on residential tree lawns placed well before the correct collection day. Pruning and trimming of trees, shrubs and hedges is a chore that must be done, but do not place any debris on your tree lawn before 5 p.m. the day preceding your collection day but no later than 7 a.m. the day of collection. Small trimmings four feet and under must be bundled with twine or contained either in yard waste bags or designated vard waste only containers (stop at the service garage office for "Yard Waste Only" stickers for your privately purchased cans). Longer branches up to a 6-inch diameter should be left long and stacked with the butt ends facing the same direction for our woodchipper to collect. We can take grass and hedge clippings, but no sod, earth, or processed wood (lumber) as part of our yard waste program.

Beginning in mid to late October the Service Department will begin vacuuming piles of leaves from treelawns as we do every year. Leaf pick-up will be on an AS-NEEDED Basis. All leaves that are collected from treelawns will be recycled, composted, and made into leaf humus or other product. It is extremely important that all leaves are piled on your treelawn for vacuum pick-up. Please DO NOT pile leaves in the street or gutter as this is a safety hazard and these leaves may not be picked up. PILED LEAVES MIXED WITH BRANCHES OR OTHER MATERIALS WILL NOT BE **PICKED UP!** 

At the end of the leaf season, should you have small quantities of leaves or other yard waste for pickup, please place them in paper yard waste bags or your designated yard waste container for pick-up on your regular collection day. We appreciate your assistance in assuring a successful leaf collection program and the responsible recycling of as much or our yard waste as possible.

### Tire Roundup

ires, off the rim, may be dropped off at the service garage during our weekend rubbish program (Saturdays and Sundays from 11:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.) during the month of September only. If you would like to dispose of your tires before this time you may drop them off at a tire dealer for disposal for a fee. This program is only for Lyndhurst residents, please bring proof of residency.
