# Tonsillectomy: Not just for kids.

Our tonsils are located at the back of the throat and serve as part of our immune system. However, removing them doesn't increase your risk for infection.

"Tonsillectomy, or surgery to remove the tonsils, is one of the most common pediatric surgeries. It's also performed on adults who suffer from recurring throat infections or have difficulty breathing during sleep," says

otolaryngologist Sanford Timen, MD, who treats patients at Cleveland Clinic Beachwood Family Health Center.

Typically performed on an outpatient basis under general anesthesia, complications from tonsillectomy are rare. However, the procedure and recovery can be more difficult for adults.

"In kids, the tonsils are mostly in the throat, but in adults, they've become recessed into tissue and are harder to

access," says Dr. Timen. "In addition, adults prone to tonsil inflammation tend to have many more years of infection than children. That can cause scarring, which makes the tonsils more difficult to remove."

So when is it time to consider surgery? Experts say if you're missing work for days at a time, you should have your tonsils checked. And if you get really sick a few times each year – to the point you cannot swallow and are missing several days of work each time – then surgery may make sense.

"It's not a fun operation, and people can experience more soreness than they expected," says Dr. Timen. "When I decide whether or not to recommend surgery, I base the decision on intensity and frequency of symptoms and their impact on daily life."

We do collect old cell phones (iPods – iPads – MP3 players and digital cameras) which are recycled for donation to the American Cancer Society.




# Annual Hydrant Program

ith the onset of spring, the Lyndhurst Fire Department will be starting its annual hydrant program. Our hydrant painter will be starting her work in May with initial priority on the any new hydrants. Then she will tackle any hydrants identified during our annual hydrant maintenance and flushing program that are in most need of attention across the city. Generally, our program ends when the school year begins but our painter this year will continue the process into the fall to get as many hydrants completed prior to the weather turning.

We do want to provide this friendly reminder that all open burning requires a permit and approval from the fire department. Construction materials, yard waste, including fallen leaves are not permitted to be burned at any time. Outdoor recreational fires must be in an approved fire pit or container with smoke not creating a nuisance or it may be required to be extinguished. Please be considerate of your neighbors that may have respiratory concerns that may be impacted by smoke from any open burning.

The Cleveland Metro Parks will be conducting a controlled burn on the Acacia Reservation Property to control invasive plant species and to control undergrowth on the property. This is a very limited burn area with Metro Parks Rangers on site the entire time and Lyndhurst Fire Department personnel on call or on site for support if needed. The controlled burn is limited to a small area of the park that has the most concerns identified by the Metro Parks.

Lastly, with the major decrease in COVID cases in the County, the fire department is now open for tours of the new fire station which can be scheduled by contacting the fire department non-emergency number at (440) 473-5139.

# From the Desk of Patrick A. Rhode, Chief of Police

### Fireworks Legislation Update - House Bill (HB) 172

The Ohio General Assembly recently enacted House Bill (HB) 172 allowing individuals to discharge, ignite or explode consumer-grade fireworks on private property on certain days throughout the year. The bill, which has also been signed by Governor DeWine, goes into effect July 1, 2022. A provision of HB 172 allows for municipalities to opt-out of the bill, and ban the discharge, ignition and explosion of fireworks that otherwise may be permitted pursuant to HB 172.

The Lyndhurst City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to continue to ban the discharge, ignition, and explosion of fireworks - now allowed by HB 172 - as currently outlined in the Lyndhurst Codified Ordinances. With the passage of Resolution 2022-22, the discharge, ignition or explosion of fireworks otherwise permitted by HB 172 is banned within the City of Lyndhurst. The passage of this resolution has been supported by both the Lyndhurst Police and Fire Departments in order to ensure that Lyndhurst remains a safe community.

We have an obligation to protect our residents and visitors from irresponsible fireworks handling and discharge. Maintaining the existing legislation surrounding fireworks still allows the police department to respond appropriately and enforce problem situations as necessary.

Police Academy in 2011, and was a Cleveland Hts. Police Officer prior to joining our ranks. Prior to leaving Cleveland Hts. PD, he was promoted from Basic Patrol Officer (BPO) to Patrol Officer (PO). In his spare time he likes to spend time with his family and play golf. Victor's uncle was a police officer in Mayfield Hts!

I look forward to watching Victor's development as a Lyndhurst Police Officer, and know that he will be an asset to the Community that he serves. Please join me in congratulating and welcoming him to the City and if you happen to see him around town, say hello!

Congratulations to Sgt. Mark McConville, who retired from the Lyndhurst Police Department

following his last tour of duty on Saturday, April 2. 2022. His retirement comes on the heels of 30 plus years of dedicated service to the City of Lyndhurst.

Sgt. McConville was hired by the City of Lyndhurst on April 15, 1991. He subsequently attended the Ohio State Highway Patrol Academy, graduating in July of 1991. Mark was promoted to Sergeant in 1998. In March of 2007, he graduated from the Police Executive and Administrative Leadership School, an executive level police management training program.

During the course of his career, Mark served as a member of LPD's police bicycle unit and has been the department's training coordinator for many years. He played an integral role in developing the department's digital payroll program, allowing for more efficient and accurate accounting for payroll. Additionally, as training coordinator, he was responsible for overseeing and tracking the annual training and education requirements for our officers. Mark was a Microsoft Excel and form "wizard," creating departmental spreadsheets and forms that improved consistency and efficiency when it came to the mountain of paperwork that comes with the job. I know, it doesn't sound very exciting. However, if you were on the receiving end of one of his products, you were very thankful...and so was the department! Mark was a regular participant in the Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics.

Mark has numerous commendations in his file, including awards for life-saving measures, felony drug/robbery/theft arrests, a high profile arrest and conviction of armed robbery/home invasion suspects in 2014. ### **Aggressive Driving**

With the arrival of spring and the warmer weather, we have undoubtedly seen an increase in motorcycle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic. All things we haven't seen over the long, cold winter months. It is imperative that with this increase in other types of "traffic", that WE as drivers, pay attention to our driving

habits to allow for the safe movement of all who use our roadways.

Aggressive driving is a threat to all - motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians. What is aggressive driving? It includes speeding, running red or yellow lights, frequent and unnecessary lane changes and following too closely or "tailgating." These behaviors can lead to crashes, road rage or both. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration defines aggressive driving as occurring when "an individual commits a combination of moving traffic offenses so as to endanger other persons or property."

It is fair to say that the majority of motorists agree that aggressive driving has become a serious problem on our roads, but many do not identify their own behaviors as aggressive. We all have a responsibility to those we share the road with. Driving should be cooperative, not competitive!

### Are you an aggressive driver? You may be if you...

- Exceed the posted speed limit
- Follow too closely
- Pass on the berm
- Cut in and out of traffic
- Fail to signal multiple lane changes
- Violate posted railroad crossing signs
- Pass a stopped school bus

- Display or use a weapon while driving
- Carelessly drive through construction zones
- Fail to vield at ramps and intersections
- Use more than one parking space

### Ways to reduce your own aggressive driving tendencies:

- Keep your emotions in check. Don't take your frustrations out on other drivers.
- Plan ahead and allow enough time for delays. Observe the speed limit.
- Focus on your own driving. Yelling, pounding on the steering wheel and honking your horn won't make traffic move any faster.

### What to do if you encounter an aggressive driver:

- Do not react to their provoking behavior
- Stay away from erratic drivers
- Use your horn sparingly
- Do not make obscene gestures
- Do not switch lanes without signaling
- Do not tailgate
- Do not block the passing lane
- Avoid eye contact with the other driver
- Call 9-1-1 for help if it is safe to do so

Sensible driving can save lives – including yours - and it starts with you.

### **Safe Spaces Positively Impact Elementary** Students' Well Being

The community may have recently seen Rowland Elementary's spotlight on Fox-8 News. Reporter and anchor Jennifer Jordan took the opportunity to interview Rowland Elementary second grade student Josiah Morgan, kindergarten to third grade School Counselor Lisa Artino, and Assistant Principal Sylvia Marshall about the Safe Spaces that have been created in our buildings to have a positive impact on their well-being. As part of the Conscious Discipline program, the SEL Schools recently introduced these Safe Spaces in every kindergarten to third grade classroom where students can follow a 5-step process listed on nearby posters to help them calm down when they are upset, anxious, or feeling other strong emotions. In doing so, students can practice selfregulation by moving from the strong emotional state triggered by the lower part of the brain to being able to problem solve and learn which are controlled by the front part of the brain. All kindergarten to third grade teachers and staff have been trained in utilizing Conscious Discipline and the five steps associated with the Safe Space program. In addition, each

elementary building has its own Safe Space for staff members to utilize to de-stress before going back into the classroom. # Fighting the Scammers!

he weekly Police Blotter routinely reports people falling victim to scammers who use threats or coercion to steal from our residents. DO NOT FALL VICTIM TO THESE CRIMINALS!

Impostor scams are among the fastest-growing scams in the country. In these scams, con artists pretend to be IRS agents, debt collectors, police or even grandchildren of their intended victims. These convincing scams have cost victims thousands of dollars apiece.

Over the last year, scammers have begun asking victims to pay them with iTunes gift cards. No legitimate government agency, no utility or legitimate business accepts payment in iTunes or other brand gift cards.

Scammers have also claimed to be holding a grandchild or other family member hostage or claiming they were involved in an accident needing cash fast to avoid harm.

Or they will send a check for an amount larger than expected and request you deposit it and wire them the difference but the check they sent you turns out to be a bad check and you end up out that money you wired.

### DO NOT BE FOOLED!

Or you receive an email that you were not expecting and it asks to you click a link or an attachment or respond - ANY OFTHOSE **ACTIONS CAN PUTYOUR IDENTITY AND** YOUR COMPUTER AT RISK.

### DO NOT SHAREYOUR INFORMATION WITH ANYONE YOU DO NOT KNOW!



### **Display your American Flag Properly and with Pride!**

It is the universal custom to display the American Flag only from sunrise to sunset on buildings and on stationery flagstaffs in the open. The Flag may be displayed 24 hours a day if properly illuminated during the hours of darkness. When displayed without a flagstaff the stars should be on the upper left.

The American Flag should not be displayed if it is worn or frayed. Any Flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way. Please bring any damaged or unusable flags to our City Service Department and they will be delivered to our local V.F.W., Boy Scouts or other agency for proper disposal.

**Remember: Flag Day is June 14!** 


