Teen Driver Safety

earning to drive a car is a rite of passage for teenagers. For their parents, the accompanying anxiety is a certainty.

National Teen Driver Safety Week occurs every October, but anytime is a smart time to discuss safety for new drivers. Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for teens. The risk of a crash is higher among 16 to 19-year-olds, than any other age group. These risks can be reduced.

Parents, guardians and other responsible adults play important roles in teaching teens how to drive. It starts with modeling good behavior. What are your personal habits regarding distracted driving? Alcohol consumption and driving? Compliance with speed limits? Following too closely? Are you an aggressive driver? What messages are you sending to the young members of your family? Teens who routinely witness a parent's unsafe habits are more likely to behave the same than children of safe drivers.

Talk to your kids about the risks. Anything that takes a driver's eyes off the road, or mind off driving, is dangerous. It can be cell phone usage or disruptive passengers. It can be ear buds and loud music. Being able to hear a vehicle horn or emergency vehicle siren is important.

Developing driving skills takes time and experience. The fifty hour minimum of supervised time for probationary driver's license applicants is just that—a minimum. You as parent or guardian can require and provide more. Be a valuable coach during this important life phase. It is also a good time to take stock of your own driving habits and make improvements where needed. (Not raising a future driver? Then let this article trigger your driving review.)

Stress the importance of wearing safety belts. Teach "lock, buckle, start." When you get in the car, first lock the doors, second fasten your seatbelt, and then start the engine. A large percentage of traffic crashes result from following too closely. Don't increase the risk of running into the vehicle in front of you when it suddenly slows or stops. There is simply no good reason for tailgating. Back off and allow at least one car length for every ten miles per hour of speed.

Emphasize the applicable laws and extra care needed during inclement weather, when on hills, curves, traffic circles, while entering and exiting freeways, proceeding through construction zones, or when passing a police officer handling a crash or traffic stop. Discuss the attention needed when traveling through parking lots, or when parking or unparking. Talk about blind spots. Remember that when pulling out of a driveway, cross traffic may include joggers, bicyclists and pedestrians in the street or on the sidewalk.

Don't forget to educate your young driver about the car itself. Proper fluid levels, tire pressure and tread depth, and good brakes are but a few areas of concern. Maintenance is every vehicle owner's responsibility.

Defensive driving is an engaged, multi-tasking technique with consistent awareness of surroundings to anticipate and avoid or effectively counter sudden dangers. Develop a habit of staying mentally aware of your own driving, and to that of nearby motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians. Routinely scan ahead, from left to right, and check your rear view and side view mirrors.

Oftentimes, motorists invite problems by failing to allow enough time to meet their travel deadlines. Speeding and impatient driving will be costly, sooner or later. Give yourself extra time and anticipate potential traffic delays so you do not rush.

Driving is a privilege that can enhance many other areas of life. But there is a tradeoff. Inexperience or bad habits of a new driver can bring a future of frustrating and expensive tickets and license suspensions, rising insurance rates, or harmful, even tragic accidents. Invest time in fostering your child's good skills and improve your own behind the wheel, and make them the foundation of safe driving.

he South Euclid Lyndhurst Schools is excited to share with the community that it has successfully completed the review and update of Destination 2023, the District's strategic plan. Building upon the plan that was extensively and collaboratively developed approximately five years ago, the District, once again, called upon stakeholders from various segments of the community to participate in the review of our plan. This edition's article from the South Euclid Lyndhurst Schools shares a bit about the process, areas of achievement and what the revised plan includes for the next five years.

To place our latest planning efforts into context, the original plan, entitled Destination 2018, was designed to provide the District with long-term direction for the forthcoming, five-year period of time. With the help of many individuals at the time, a revised mission statement was created, a vision was cast "to be The Destination School Community," core values were jointly established, and four areas of focus were outlined as the basis of future District goals. The multi-month review of our current strategic plan took place between January and May 2018. Four committees comprised of community members, staff members, elected leadership and others, were created to assess the status of each of the four areas of focus and their respective action steps for achievement. The areas of review included Teaching and Learning, Communications and Partnerships, School Community Climate and Facilities. In total, more than 50 individuals came together, some who participated in the process five years ago, and some who were altogether new, to review the plan in line-by-line fashion. The SEL Schools thanks all of the members of the process for their exhaustive and comprehensive review.

The SEL Schools realized a number of noteworthy accomplishments over the last five years. One such was the deliberate effort to enhance the teaching and learning in the District through the installation of highly innovative technology solutions in each and every classroom, elementary school through high school, in our District. Today, students and teachers thrive in classrooms

that feature state-of-the-art white board technology, sound enhancement systems, access to the Internet, robust online academic programming and innovative opportunities to collaborate. Further, the enrichment of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (S.T.E.M.) curriculum and lab experiences at all grade levels has exposed students to practical problem-solving skills that will be useful as they pursue college and career endeavors. The District views the successful re-branding of the SEL Schools as another successful stride to bringing excitement, enthusiasm and energy to the school community as well.

The revised strategic plan builds upon the foundation outlined from the first version. While the mission, vision, core values and goals have generally remained the same, new points of focus position the District for future success in the next five years. Highlights include an emphasis on cultivating PreK-12 learning opportunities, with the belief that the earlier a student can become exposed to our educational approach, the more successful they can be over their academic careers. The SEL Schools seeks to provide deeper learning competencies and enriched academic experiences to produce students that are college, career and life-ready. In addition, facilities will continue to be closely monitored and upgraded to enhance school safety. Exterior building maintenance and beautification will continue to be a top priority. Finally, from a communications perspective, the District will seek to further enhance how it communicates and remains engaged with the community through the launch of a new website for the coming school year.

In all, and on behalf of the SEL Schools, thank you once again to everyone who was involved in the review and creation of Destination 2023, the District's revised strategic plan. We all use this plan to thoughtfully guide us into the future, and with your help, will become the "Destination School Community."





Yard Waste Disposal

Driving around the City, we have noticed an abundance of yard debris on residential treelawns not on the correct collection day. Pruning and trimming of trees, shrubs and hedges is a chore that must be done, but do not place any debris on your treelawn before 5 p.m. the day preceding your collection day - no later than 7 a.m. the day of collection. Small trimmings four feet and under must be bundled with twine or contained either in yard waste bags or designated "Yard Waste Only" containers (stop at the service garage office for "Yard Waste Only" stickers for your privately purchased cans). Longer branches up to a 6-inch diameter should be left long and stacked with the butt ends facing the same direction for our wood chipper to collect. We can take grass and hedge clippings, but no sod, earth or processed wood (lumber) with our yard waste program.

September Tire Roundup

Tires, off the rim, may be dropped off at the service garage during our weekend rubbish program during the month of September. If you would like to dispose of your tires before this time you may drop them off at a tire dealer for disposal for a fee. This program is only for Lyndhurst residents. Please bring proof of residency.

Hazardous Household Waste (HHW) Disposal

Every Saturday and Sunday through November 18th from 11:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. residents can bring rubbish, yard waste, and hazardous household waste to the service garage for disposal. Hazardous household waste such as paint, pesticides, long tube fluorescent bulbs and household cleaners may be dropped off at the service garage during our weekend rubbish program Saturday and Sunday 11:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., or Monday through Friday 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. year round. Please bring your HHW for disposal in the original sealed containers. This program is only for Lyndhurst residents. Please bring proof of residency.

Prescription Pill Drop-off

Do you have any unwanted or unused prescription pills in your Medicine Cabinet?

Protect your loved ones by safely disposing of these pills in a secure drop-box located in the lobby of City Hall - 7 days a week at any time.

Seasons of Change!

LEAVES Our City Service Department will be vacuuming piles of leaves from treelawns as we do every year. Leaf pickup will be on an AS-NEEDED basis.

All leaves that are collected from treelawns will be recycled, composted and made into leaf humus or other product. It is extremely important that all leaves are piled on your tree lawn for vacuum pickup. Please DO NOT pile leaves in the street or gutter as this is a safety hazard and these leaves may not be picked up.

PILED LEAVES MIXED WITH BRANCHES OR OTHER MATERIALS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP!

At the end of the leaf season, should you have small quantities of leaves for pickup, please place them in paper yard waste bags or your designated yard waste container for pickup on your regular collection day.


We appreciate your assistance in assuring a successful leaf collection program and the responsible recycling of as much or our yard waste as possible.

NOW PLOWING Winter is not too far away and you may soon be contacted by snowplow contractors regarding the plowing of your driveway this winter. The City requires all commercial snowplow operators register with the City and obtain a permit. This is for your protection as we assure the vehicles are properly registered, properly insured and are equipped with the necessary emergency equipment.

While the City cannot assure the performance of your contracted operator, if they are registered with the City, you know they are aware of the City's expectations!

Please remember that it is illegal to deposit snow in the street or block public sidewalks when plowing, shoveling or snow blowing your driveway. Violators may be prosecuted.

Please be sure your snowplow contractor is properly registered.
